Associations of "Discarding" (30 Words)

abandon	Cease to support or look after (someone); desert. <i>She danced with abandon.</i>
abandonment	The action or fact of abandoning or being abandoned. <i>His abandonment of his wife and children left them penniless.</i>
bin	Group together data in bins. <i>The whole idea had to be binned.</i>
carelessly	Without care or concern. <i>Carelessly raised the children s hopes without thinking of their possible disappointment.</i>
detritus	The remains of something that has been destroyed or broken up. <i>The streets were foul with detritus.</i>
<u>discarded</u>	Thrown away.
<u>dismiss</u>	Remove from employment or office, typically on the grounds of unsatisfactory performance. <i>I was dismissed after I gave my report.</i>
disposal	The action or process of getting rid of something. <i>Used all the resources at his disposal.</i>
dispose	Determine the course of events. <i>She watched him dispose of a large slice of cheese.</i>
dump	A piece of land where waste materials are dumped. <i>Why are you living in a dump like this.</i>
dumping	Selling goods abroad at a price below that charged in the domestic market.
eliminate	Eliminate from the body. <i>This possibility can be eliminated from our consideration.</i>
<u>garbage</u>	Unwanted data in a computer’s memory. <i>A store full of overpriced garbage.</i>

incinerator	An apparatus for burning waste material, especially industrial waste, at high temperatures until it is reduced to ash.
jettison	The action of jettisoning something. <i>The scheme was jettisoned.</i>
junk	Junk bonds. <i>You do anything for junk cheat lie steal.</i>
landfill	Bury in a landfill. <i>Many tons of edible food are landfilled.</i>
litter	Provide a horse or other animal with litter as bedding. <i>Clothes and newspapers littered the floor.</i>
overboard	To extremes. <i>The severe storm washed a man overboard.</i>
recycle	Use again. <i>Car hulks were recycled into new steel.</i>
recycling	The action or process of converting waste into reusable material. <i>I forgot to take out the recycling.</i>
refuse	Refuse to accept. <i>I refused to answer.</i>
reuse	Use again or more than once. <i>The tape could be magnetically erased and reused.</i>
rubble	Waste or rough fragments of stone, brick, concrete, etc., especially as the debris from the demolition of buildings. <i>The tower is built of stone rubble faced with ashlar.</i>
shed	Shed at an early stage of development. <i>Our dog sheds every Spring.</i>
squander	Spend thoughtlessly; throw away. <i>100m of taxpayers money has been squandered on administering the tax.</i>
trash	Nonsensical talk or writing. <i>Trade associations trashed the legislation as deficient.</i>
waste	Run off as waste. <i>We waste the dirty water by channeling it into the sewer.</i>
wastebasket	A container with an open top; for discarded paper and other rubbish.
