## Associations of "Discarding" (30 Words)

<b>abandon</b>	Cease to support or look after (someone); desert. <i>She danced with <b>abandon</b>.</i>
<b>abandonment</b>	The action or fact of abandoning or being abandoned. <i>His <b>abandonment</b> of his wife and children left them penniless.</i>
<b>bin</b>	Group together data in bins. <i>The whole idea had to be <b>binned</b>.</i>
<b>carelessly</b>	Without care or concern. <i><b>Carelessly</b> raised the children s hopes without thinking of their possible disappointment.</i>
<b>detritus</b>	The remains of something that has been destroyed or broken up. <i>The streets were foul with <b>detritus</b>.</i>
<b><u>discarded</u></b>	Thrown away.
<b><u>dismiss</u></b>	Remove from employment or office, typically on the grounds of unsatisfactory performance. <i>I was <b>dismissed</b> after I gave my report.</i>
<b>disposal</b>	The action or process of getting rid of something. <i>Used all the resources at his <b>disposal</b>.</i>
<b>dispose</b>	Determine the course of events. <i>She watched him <b>dispose</b> of a large slice of cheese.</i>
<b>dump</b>	A piece of land where waste materials are dumped. <i>Why are you living in a <b>dump</b> like this.</i>
<b>dumping</b>	Selling goods abroad at a price below that charged in the domestic market.
<b>eliminate</b>	Eliminate from the body. <i>This possibility can be <b>eliminated</b> from our consideration.</i>
<b><u>garbage</u></b>	Unwanted data in a computer’s memory. <i>A store full of overpriced <b>garbage</b>.</i>

<b>incinerator</b>	An apparatus for burning waste material, especially industrial waste, at high temperatures until it is reduced to ash.
<b>jettison</b>	The action of jettisoning something. <i>The scheme was <b>jettisoned</b>.</i>
<b>junk</b>	Junk bonds. <i>You do anything for <b>junk</b> cheat lie steal.</i>
<b>landfill</b>	Bury in a landfill. <i>Many tons of edible food are <b>landfilled</b>.</i>
<b>litter</b>	Provide a horse or other animal with litter as bedding. <i>Clothes and newspapers <b>littered</b> the floor.</i>
<b>overboard</b>	To extremes. <i>The severe storm washed a man <b>overboard</b>.</i>
<b>recycle</b>	Use again. <i>Car hulks were <b>recycled</b> into new steel.</i>
<b>recycling</b>	The action or process of converting waste into reusable material. <i>I forgot to take out the <b>recycling</b>.</i>
<b>refuse</b>	Refuse to accept. <i>I <b>refused</b> to answer.</i>
<b>reuse</b>	Use again or more than once. <i>The tape could be magnetically erased and <b>reused</b>.</i>
<b>rubble</b>	Waste or rough fragments of stone, brick, concrete, etc., especially as the debris from the demolition of buildings. <i>The tower is built of stone <b>rubble</b> faced with ashlar.</i>
<b>shed</b>	Shed at an early stage of development. <i>Our dog <b>sheds</b> every Spring.</i>
<b>squander</b>	Spend thoughtlessly; throw away. <i>100m of taxpayers money has been <b>squandered</b> on administering the tax.</i>
<b>trash</b>	Nonsensical talk or writing. <i>Trade associations <b>trashed</b> the legislation as deficient.</i>
<b>waste</b>	Run off as waste. <i>We <b>waste</b> the dirty water by channeling it into the sewer.</i>
<b>wastebasket</b>	A container with an open top; for discarded paper and other rubbish.
