According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "discipline" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Train oneself to do something in a controlled and habitual way.
- Develop (children's) behavior by instruction and practice; especially to teach selfcontrol.
- Develop (a child's or animal's) behavior by instruction and practice; especially to teach self-control.
- Punish in order to gain control or enforce obedience.
- Train (someone) to obey rules or a code of behaviour, using punishment to correct disobedience.
- Punish or rebuke formally for an offence.
