<u>chivalrous</u>	Being attentive to women like an ideal knight. <i>The concept of chivalrous combat.</i>
<u>civil</u>	Relating to civil law. <i>Civil peoples.</i>
<u>civilized</u>	Marked by refinement in taste and manners. <i>A civilized society.</i>
<u>considerate</u>	Showing concern for the rights and feelings of others. <i>Be considerate over your handwriting.</i>
<u>courteous</u>	Exhibiting courtesy and politeness. <i>She was courteous and obliging to all.</i>
cultivated	Marked by refinement in taste and manners. <i>Cultivated roses.</i>

decorous	Characterized by propriety and dignity and good taste in manners and conduct. <i>Charlotte gave David a decorous kiss.</i>
deferential	Showing deference; respectful. <i>People were always deferential to him.</i>
formal	Being in accord with established forms and conventions and requirements as e.g. of formal dress. <i>Formal dress.</i>
<u>gallant</u>	(of a person or their behaviour) brave; heroic. <i>A gallant gentleman came over and kissed my hand.</i>
genteel	Characterized by exaggerated or affected politeness, refinement, or respectability. <i>A genteel old lady.</i>
gentlemanly	Befitting a man of good breeding. <i>His gentlemanly behaviour.</i>
<u>gracious</u>	Characterized by charm, good taste, and generosity of spirit. <i>Greig was gracious in defeat.</i>
ladylike	Befitting a woman of good breeding. <i>It wasn't ladylike to be too interested in men.</i>
<u>obedient</u>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>Children are taught to be obedient to their parents.</i>
obliging	Showing a cheerful willingness to do favors for others. <i>One of the most obliging stewards.</i>
<u>polished</u>	Shiny as a result of being rubbed. <i>He was polished and charming.</i>
<u>polite</u>	Showing regard for others in manners, speech, behavior, etc. <i>Polite society.</i>
proper	Limited to the thing specified. <i>After this event three countries will progress to the World Cup proper.</i>
<u>refined</u>	Freed from impurities by processing. <i>Refined oil.</i>
respectful	Feeling or showing deference and respect. <i>Respectful behavior.</i>
thoughtful	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>Her work is thoughtful and provocative.</i>

- urbane** Courteous and refined in manner (typically used of a man).
Urbane wit was the mark of taste and cultivation.
- well brought up** Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
- well mannered** In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.
- well spoken** In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

Be appropriate or applicable.
*The answers generally **appertain** to improvements in standard of service.*

Come close to (a number, level, or standard) in quality or quantity.
*I was **approached** by the President to serve as his adviser in foreign matters.*

ascetic	Pertaining to or characteristic of an ascetic or the practice of rigorous self discipline. <i>Be systematically ascetic do something for no other reason than that you would rather not do it.</i>
<u>austere</u>	Severely simple. <i>A desert nomad s austere life.</i>
behest	An authoritative command or request. <i>They had assembled at his behest.</i>
contained	Gotten under control. <i>The oil spill is contained.</i>
controlled	(of an explosion) produced deliberately under conditions that are determined beforehand. <i>The office was in a state of controlled chaos.</i>
cultivated	Marked by refinement in taste and manners. <i>He was a remarkably cultivated and educated man.</i>
cultured	Characterized by refined taste and manners and good education. <i>Cultured tumour cells.</i>
domesticated	(of a plant) cultivated for food; naturalized. <i>Domesticated crops.</i>
dominated	Harassed by persistent nagging.
educated	Having been educated. <i>A Harvard educated lawyer.</i>
guidance	Advice or information aimed at resolving a problem or difficulty, especially as given by someone in authority. <i>He looked to his father for inspiration and guidance.</i>
manage	Be the manager of a sports team or a performer. <i>The forest is managed to achieve maximum growth.</i>
<u>moderation</u>	The action of making something less extreme, intense, or violent. <i>The union s approach was based on increased dialogue and the moderation of demands.</i>
proficiency	Skillfulness in the command of fundamentals deriving from practice and familiarity. <i>Practice greatly improves proficiency.</i>
protocol	A formal or official record of scientific experimental observations. <i>What is the protocol at a smart lunch if one s neighbour dozes off during the speeches.</i>

puritan	Having or displaying censorious moral beliefs, especially about self-indulgence and sex. <i>My mother was a puritan about sex.</i>
refrain	Choose not to consume. <i>She refrained from comment.</i>
regulate	Control or maintain the rate or speed of (a machine or process) so that it operates properly. <i>The Code regulates the takeovers of all public companies.</i>
remotely	In a remote manner. <i>The meeting was the first to be held remotely using conferencing software.</i>
restrained	Prudent. <i>Restrained in his response.</i>
simplicity	Absence of affectation or pretense. <i>The simplicity of a crystal.</i>
subdued	Lacking in light; not bright or harsh. <i>Subdued lights and soft music.</i>
superintendence	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>The school was under the superintendence of the nuns of the convent.</i>
supervision	The action of supervising someone or something. <i>He was placed under the supervision of a probation officer.</i>
tame	(of a plant) produced by cultivation. <i>The author finally tamed some of his potentially offensive statements.</i>
trained	Having been taught a particular skill or type of behaviour through practice and instruction over a period of time. <i>A trained mind.</i>
understatement	A statement that is restrained in ironic contrast to what might have been said. <i>A master of English understatement.</i>
