<u>anarchy</u>	The organization of society on the basis of voluntary cooperation, without political institutions or hierarchical government; anarchism. <i>He must ensure public order in a country threatened with anarchy.</i>
befuddle	Be confusing or perplexing to; cause to be unable to think clearly. <i>The logic used to arrive at this conclusion befuddles me.</i>
bewildered	Perplexed and confused; very puzzled. <i>Bewildered and confused.</i>
chaos	A dynamical system that is extremely sensitive to its initial conditions. <i>Snow caused chaos in the region.</i>
<u>chaotic</u>	In a state of complete confusion and disorder. <i>The political situation was chaotic.</i>
<u>complicated</u>	Consisting of many interconnecting parts or elements; intricate. <i>Complicated Middle East politics.</i>
confound	Defeat (a plan, aim, or hope). <i>We will confound these tactics by the pressure groups.</i>
confusing	Bewildering or perplexing. <i>A confusing jumble of road signs.</i>
convulsion	An earthquake or other violent or major movement of the earth's crust. <i>The convulsions of the stock market.</i>
discomfit	Make (someone) feel uneasy or embarrassed. <i>He was not noticeably discomfited by her tone.</i>
disconcerted	Having self-possession upset; thrown into confusion- G.B.Shaw. <i>Keith looked momentarily disconcerted.</i>
disorder	Bring disorder to. <i>Recurrent food crises led to outbreaks of disorder.</i>
disorient	Cause someone to lose their sense of direction disorientate. <i>I was disoriented by the dark.</i>
enigmatic	Difficult to interpret or understand; mysterious. <i>So enigmatic that priests might have to clarify it.</i>
hastily	In a hurried or hasty manner. <i>Hastily he scanned the headlines.</i>
hurriedly	In a hurried or hasty manner. <i>The way they buried him so hurriedly was disgraceful.</i>
jumble	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>His words jumbled.</i>
melee	A confused crowd of people. <i>Several people were hurt in the melee.</i>

mess	Eat in a mess hall. <i>A mess of porridge.</i>
<u>messy</u>	Dirty and disorderly. <i>A messy divorce.</i>
<u>misleading</u>	Designed to deceive or mislead either deliberately or inadvertently. <i>Your article contains a number of misleading statements.</i>
mysterious	Of an obscure nature- Rachel. <i>She was mysterious about herself but said plenty about her husband.</i>
mystify	Make obscure or mysterious. <i>Lawyers who mystify the legal system so that laymen find it unintelligible.</i>
<u>obfuscate</u>	Make obscure, unclear, or unintelligible. <i>The spelling changes will deform some familiar words and obfuscate their etymological origins.</i>
perplexing	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i>Perplexing to someone who knew nothing about it.</i>
<u>puzzling</u>	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i>Only one very puzzling question remains unanswered.</i>
questioning	Showing curiosity. <i>There was no questioning of the decision.</i>
quickly	With rapid movements. <i>We moved quickly to deal with our auditor's questions.</i>
<u>turmoil</u>	A violent disturbance. <i>He endured years of inner turmoil.</i>
<u>unclear</u>	Not easy to see, hear, or understand. <i>The motive for this killing is unclear.</i>
