<u>anarchy</u>	The organization of society on the basis of voluntary cooperation, without political institutions or hierarchical government; anarchism. <i>He must ensure public order in a country threatened with <b>anarchy</b>.</i>
befuddle	Be confusing or perplexing to; cause to be unable to think clearly. The logic used to arrive at this conclusion <b>befuddle</b> s me.
bewildered	Perplexed and confused; very puzzled. <i>Bewildered</i> and confused.
chaos	A dynamical system that is extremely sensitive to its initial conditions. Snow caused <b>chaos</b> in the region.
<u>chaotic</u>	In a state of complete confusion and disorder. <i>The political situation was chaotic</i> .
<u>complicated</u>	Consisting of many interconnecting parts or elements; intricate. <b>Complicated</b> Middle East politics.
confound	Defeat (a plan, aim, or hope. We will <b>confound</b> these tactics by the pressure groups.
confusing	Bewildering or perplexing. A <b>confusing</b> jumble of road signs.
convulsion	An earthquake or other violent or major movement of the earth's crust. <i>The convulsions of the stock market.</i>
discomfit	Make (someone) feel uneasy or embarrassed. <i>He was not noticeably</i> <b>discomfit</b> ed by her tone.
disconcerted	Having self-possession upset; thrown into confusion- G.B.Shaw. <i>Keith looked momentarily</i> <b>disconcerted</b> .
disorder	Bring disorder to. Recurrent food crises led to outbreaks of <b>disorder</b> .
disorient	Cause someone to lose their sense of direction disorientate. I was <b>disorient</b> ed by the dark.
enigmatic	Difficult to interpret or understand; mysterious. So <b>enigmatic</b> that priests might have to clarify it.
hastily	In a hurried or hasty manner. <i>Hastily</i> he scanned the headlines.
hurriedly	In a hurried or hasty manner. The way they buried him so <b>hurriedly</b> was disgraceful.
jumble	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>His words <b>jumble</b>d</i> .
melee	A confused crowd of people. Several people were hurt in the <b>melee</b> .



mess	Eat in a mess hall. A <b>mess</b> of porridge.
<u>messy</u>	Dirty and disorderly. A <b>messy</b> divorce.
<u>misleading</u>	Designed to deceive or mislead either deliberately or inadvertently. Your article contains a number of <b>misleading</b> statements.
mysterious	Of an obscure nature- Rachel. She was <b>mysterious</b> about herself but said plenty about her husband.
mystify	Make obscure or mysterious. Lawyers who <b>mystify</b> the legal system so that laymen find it unintelligible.
<u>obfuscate</u>	Make obscure, unclear, or unintelligible. The spelling changes will deform some familiar words and <b>obfuscate</b> their etymological origins.
perplexing	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <b>Perplexing</b> to someone who knew nothing about it.
puzzling	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. Only one very <b>puzzling</b> question remains unanswered.
questioning	Showing curiosity. There was no <b>questioning</b> of the decision.
quickly	With rapid movements. We moved <b>quickly</b> to deal with our auditor s questions.
<u>turmoil</u>	A violent disturbance. He endured years of inner <b>turmoil</b> .
<u>unclear</u>	Not easy to see, hear, or understand. The motive for this killing is <b>unclear</b> .
