<b>befuddle</b>	Be confusing or perplexing to; cause to be unable to think clearly. <i>The logic used to arrive at this conclusion <b>befuddles</b> me.</i>
<b>bewildered</b>	Perplexed and confused; very puzzled. <i><b>Bewildered</b> and confused.</i>
<b>chaos</b>	A dynamical system that is extremely sensitive to its initial conditions. <i>Snow caused <b>chaos</b> in the region.</i>
<b><u>chaotic</u></b>	In a state of complete confusion and disorder. <i>The political situation was <b>chaotic</b>.</i>
<b><u>complicated</u></b>	Consisting of many interconnecting parts or elements; intricate. <i><b>Complicated</b> Middle East politics.</i>
<b>confound</b>	Defeat (a plan, aim, or hope). <i>We will <b>confound</b> these tactics by the pressure groups.</i>
<b>confusing</b>	Bewildering or perplexing. <i>A <b>confusing</b> jumble of road signs.</i>
<b>convulsion</b>	An earthquake or other violent or major movement of the earth's crust. <i>The <b>convulsions</b> of the stock market.</i>
<b>discomfit</b>	Make (someone) feel uneasy or embarrassed. <i>He was not noticeably <b>discomfited</b> by her tone.</i>
<b>disconcerted</b>	Having self-possession upset; thrown into confusion- G.B.Shaw. <i>Keith looked momentarily <b>disconcerted</b>.</i>
<b>disorder</b>	Bring disorder to. <i>Recurrent food crises led to outbreaks of <b>disorder</b>.</i>
<b>disorient</b>	Cause someone to lose their sense of direction disorientate. <i>I was <b>disoriented</b> by the dark.</i>
<b>enigmatic</b>	Difficult to interpret or understand; mysterious. <i>So <b>enigmatic</b> that priests might have to clarify it.</i>
<b>hastily</b>	In a hurried or hasty manner. <i><b>Hastily</b> he scanned the headlines.</i>
<b>hurriedly</b>	In a hurried or hasty manner. <i>The way they buried him so <b>hurriedly</b> was disgraceful.</i>
<b>jumble</b>	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>His words <b>jumbled</b>.</i>
<b>melee</b>	A confused crowd of people. <i>Several people were hurt in the <b>melee</b>.</i>

<b>mess</b>	Eat in a mess hall. <i>A <b>mess</b> of porridge.</i>
<b><u>messy</u></b>	Dirty and disorderly. <i>A <b>messy</b> divorce.</i>
<b><u>misleading</u></b>	Designed to deceive or mislead either deliberately or inadvertently. <i>Your article contains a number of <b>misleading</b> statements.</i>
<b>mysterious</b>	Of an obscure nature- Rachel. <i>She was <b>mysterious</b> about herself but said plenty about her husband.</i>
<b>mystify</b>	Make obscure or mysterious. <i>Lawyers who <b>mystify</b> the legal system so that laymen find it unintelligible.</i>
<b><u>obfuscate</u></b>	Make obscure, unclear, or unintelligible. <i>The spelling changes will deform some familiar words and <b>obfuscate</b> their etymological origins.</i>
<b>perplexing</b>	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i><b>Perplexing</b> to someone who knew nothing about it.</i>
<b><u>puzzling</u></b>	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i>Only one very <b>puzzling</b> question remains unanswered.</i>
<b>questioning</b>	Showing curiosity. <i>There was no <b>questioning</b> of the decision.</i>
<b>quickly</b>	With rapid movements. <i>We moved <b>quickly</b> to deal with our auditor's questions.</i>
<b><u>turmoil</u></b>	A violent disturbance. <i>He endured years of inner <b>turmoil</b>.</i>
<b><u>unclear</u></b>	Not easy to see, hear, or understand. <i>The motive for this killing is <b>unclear</b>.</i>
