advised	Having received information. <i>You would be advised to check on increases to your pension.</i>
alert	A warning serves to make you more alert to danger. <i>Security forces are on the alert for an upsurge in violence.</i>
attentive	Giving care or attention. <i>Attentive to details.</i>
beware	Be cautious and alert to risks or dangers. <i>Shoppers were warned to beware of cut price fakes.</i>
careful	Making sure of avoiding potential danger, mishap, or harm; cautious. <i>Careful of the rights of others.</i>
carefully	As if with kid gloves; with caution or prudence or tact. <i>They must be carefully handled and stored.</i>
carefulness	The trait of being cautious; being attentive to possible danger. <i>I admired the carefulness of his work.</i>
caution	Warning. <i>Anyone receiving a suspect package should exercise extreme caution.</i>
cautious	People who are fearful and cautious. <i>Firms have been unusually cautious about hiring new workers.</i>
cautiously	In a conservative manner. <i>We must proceed cautiously.</i>
chary	Cautiously or suspiciously reluctant to do something. <i>Chary of the risks involved.</i>
circumspect	Heedful of potential consequences. <i>Circumspect actions.</i>
conscientious	Wishing to do one’s work or duty well and thoroughly. <i>The individual is denied even the opportunity to break the law on conscientious grounds.</i>

consider	Regard or treat with consideration respect and esteem. <i>I don't consider that I'm to blame.</i>
<u>deliberate</u>	Consider (a question) carefully. <i>A deliberate attempt to provoke conflict.</i>
<u>deliberation</u>	Discussion of all sides of a question. <i>The commission's deliberations.</i>
<u>discreet</u>	Unobtrusively perceptive and sympathetic. <i>A discreet cough.</i>
<u>discretion</u>	The power of making free choices unconstrained by external agencies. <i>I'll be the soul of discretion.</i>
forethought	Judiciousness in avoiding harm or danger. <i>Jim had the forethought to book in advance.</i>
measured	(of speech or writing) carefully considered and restrained. <i>His measured prose.</i>
<u>mindful</u>	Inclined or willing to do something. <i>A mindful approach to life helps us to let go of the stress that often comes with conflicts in relationships.</i>
modesty	Behaviour, manner, or appearance intended to avoid impropriety or indecency. <i>With typical modesty he insisted on sharing the credit with others.</i>
<u>perfunctory</u>	As a formality only. <i>Perfunctory courtesy.</i>
precaution	A precautionary measure warding off impending danger or damage or injury etc. <i>He had taken the precaution of seeking legal advice.</i>
<u>prudent</u>	Acting with or showing care and thought for the future. <i>More prudent to hide than to fight.</i>
solicitous	Eager or anxious to do something. <i>He was solicitous to cultivate her mother's good opinion.</i>
thoughtful	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>A deeply thoughtful essay.</i>
<u>warn</u>	Give (someone) cautionary advice about their actions or conduct. <i>Traffic signals warned of fog.</i>
wary	Feeling or showing caution about possible dangers or problems. <i>A wary glance at the black clouds.</i>
watchful	Experiencing or accompanied by sleeplessness- Shakespeare. <i>Twenty watchful weary tedious nights.</i>
