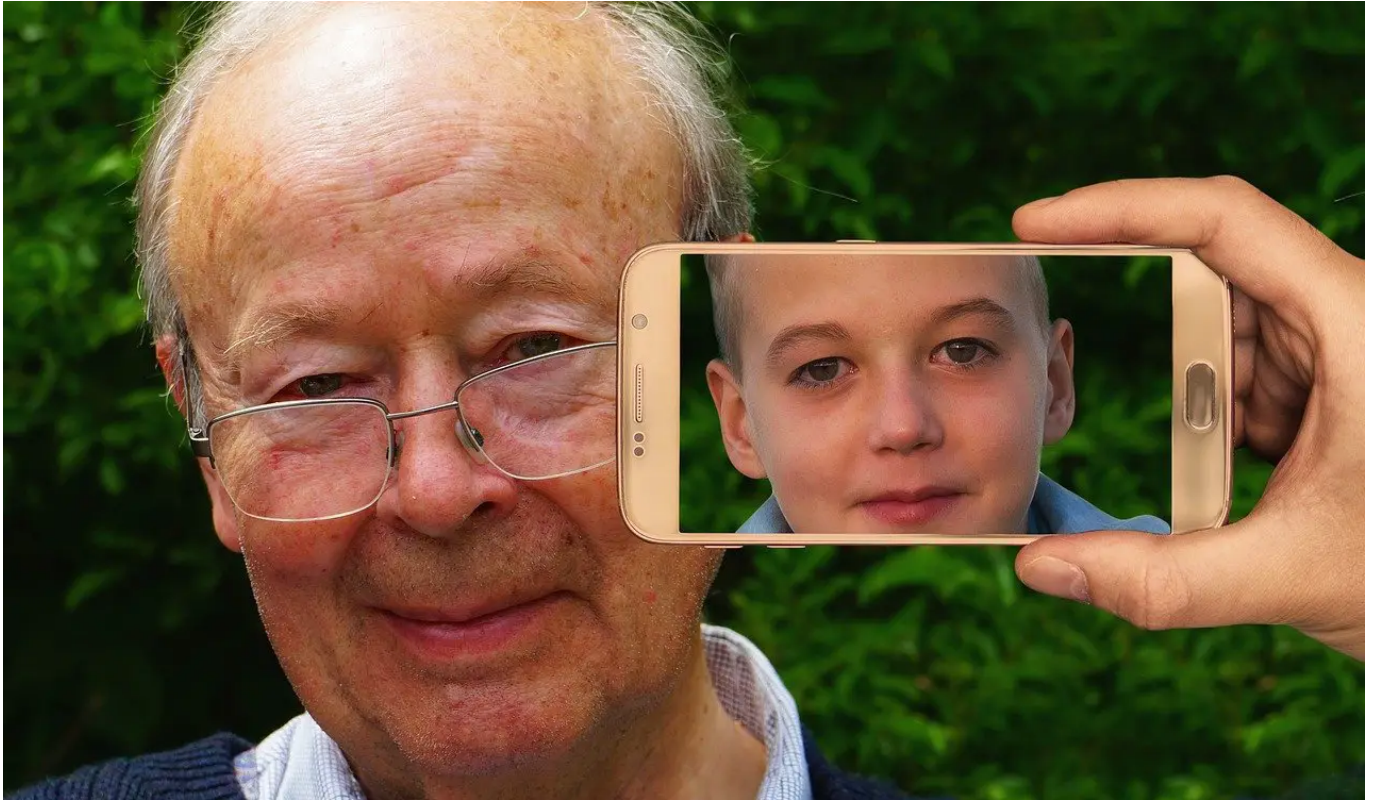

Discrepancies as a Noun

Definitions of "Discrepancies" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “discrepancies” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An event that departs from expectations.*
- *A difference between conflicting facts or claims or opinions.*



Synonyms of "Discrepancies" as a noun (4 Words)

disagreement Lack of consistency or correspondence.
*There was some **disagreement** about the details.*

divergence A place where airflows or ocean currents diverge, typically marked by downwelling (of air) or upwelling (of water).
*An angle is formed by the **divergence** of two straight lines.*

variance The fact or quality of being different, divergent, or inconsistent.
*The stylistic **variances** of classical dance.*

variant A form or version of something that differs in some respect from other forms of the same thing or from a standard.
*Clinically distinct **variants** of malaria.*



Associations of "Discrepancies" (30 Words)

- antinomy** A contradiction between two statements that seem equally reasonable.
There are not many short novels capable of accommodating bewildering antinomies.
- conflict** Be in conflict.
*He was immobilized by **conflict** and indecision.*
- conflicting** On bad terms.
***Conflicting** opinions.*
- contradict** Be in contradiction with.
*The survey appears to **contradict** the industry's claims.*
- contradiction** Opposition between two conflicting forces or ideas.
*The paradox of using force to overcome force is a real **contradiction**.*
- contradictory** A contradictory proposition.
*The two studies came to **contradictory** conclusions.*
- controversy** A contentious speech act; a dispute where there is strong disagreement.
*The announcement ended a protracted **controversy**.*

cracked	(of a person's voice) having an unusual harshness or pitch, especially through strain. <i>The captain was screaming orders in a cracked baritone.</i>
<u>disagreement</u>	Lack of consistency or correspondence. <i>Disagreements between parents and adolescents.</i>
<u>discord</u>	A harsh mixture of sounds. <i>The music faded in discord.</i>
<u>discordant</u>	Lacking in harmony. <i>The operative principle of democracy is a balance of discordant qualities.</i>
discrepant	Not in agreement. <i>The reasons for these discrepant results are unclear.</i>
dispute	A disagreement between management and employees that leads to industrial action. <i>A territorial dispute between the two countries.</i>
dissension	Disagreement among those expected to cooperate. <i>These issues caused bitter dissension in the party.</i>
dissonance	The auditory experience of sound that lacks musical quality; sound that is a disagreeable auditory experience. <i>The party faithful might be willing to put up with such dissonance among their candidates.</i>
dissonant	Not in accord. <i>Jackson employs both harmonious and dissonant colour choices.</i>
<u>divergence</u>	An infinite series that has no limit. <i>The divergence between primates and other groups.</i>
<u>divisive</u>	Dissenting (especially dissenting with the majority opinion). <i>The highly divisive issue of abortion.</i>
factious	Relating or inclined to dissension. <i>A factious country.</i>
<u>incompatible</u>	Not suitable to your tastes or needs. <i>Incompatible personalities.</i>
<u>incongruous</u>	Lacking in harmony or compatibility or appropriateness. <i>Incongruous behavior.</i>
<u>inconsistency</u>	The relation between propositions that cannot both be true at the same time. <i>The inconsistency between his expressed attitudes and his actual behaviour.</i>
inconsistent	Displaying a lack of consistency. <i>Inconsistent with the roadmap.</i>

- inharmonious** Not forming or contributing to a pleasing whole; discordant.
*An **inharmonious** or incongruous mixture of architectural styles.*
- irony** The expression of one's meaning by using language that normally signifies the opposite, typically for humorous or emphatic effect.
***Irony** is wasted on the stupid.*
- oppose** Be against; express opposition to.
*We **oppose** the ban on abortion.*
- opposing** In conflict or competition with someone or something.
*The **opposing** team.*
- oxymoron** A figure of speech in which apparently contradictory terms appear in conjunction (e.g. faith unfaithful kept him falsely true).
- paradoxical** Seemingly contradictory but nonetheless possibly true.
*By glorifying the acts of violence they achieve the **paradoxical** effect of making them trivial.*
- strife** Angry or bitter disagreement over fundamental issues; conflict.
***Strife** within the community.*
