## **Discusses as a Verb**

### **Definitions of "Discusses" as a verb**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “discusses” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *To consider or examine in speech or writing.*
- *Speak with others about (something); talk (something) over in detail; have a discussion.*



## Synonyms of "Discusses" as a verb (4 Words)

**discourse** Engage in conversation.  
*She could **discourse** at great length on the history of Europe.*

**hash out** Chop up.

**talk about** Express in speech.

**talk over** Use language.



## Usage Examples of "Discusses" as a verb

- *We discussed our household budget.*
- *The class discussed Dante's `Inferno.*





## Associations of "Discusses" (30 Words)

### chat

Songbirds having a chattering call.

*She **chatted** to her mother on the phone every day.*

### **communication**

The successful conveying or sharing of ideas and feelings.

*A **communications** network.*

### **conciliator**

Someone who tries to bring peace.

*He was seen as a **conciliator** who would heal divisions in the party.*

### **confabulate**

Fabricate imaginary experiences as compensation for loss of memory.

*She could be heard on the telephone **confabulating** with someone.*

### confer

Have a conference in order to talk something over.

*We **conferred** about a plan of action.*

### conference

Take part in a conference or conference call.

*He gathered all the men around the baize table for a **conference**.*

| <b>debate</b>               | Have an argument about something.<br><i>There has been much <b>debate</b> about prices.</i>  |
| <b><u>dialogue</u></b>      | Provide a film or play with a dialogue.<br><i>Passages of <b>dialogue</b>.</i>   |
| <b><u>discourse</u></b>     | Speak or write authoritatively about a topic.<br><i>The language of political <b>discourse</b>.</i>  |
| <b>discussion</b>           | A detailed treatment of a topic in speech or writing.<br><i>The book contains an excellent <b>discussion</b> of modal logic.</i>           |
| <b>disputation</b>          | Formal academic debate.<br><i>Scholastic <b>disputations</b>.</i>  |
| <b>dispute</b>              | Resist (a landing or advance).<br><i>The accusations are not <b>disputed</b>.</i>  |

| <b>forum</b>                | A court or tribunal.<br><i>We hope these pages act as a <b>forum</b> for debate.</i>   |
| <b>hassel</b>               | Norwegian chemist noted for his research on organic molecules (1897-1981).   |
| <b>interlocutor</b>         | A person who takes part in a conversation.   |
| <b><u>negotiable</u></b>    | (of a route) able to be traversed; passable.<br><i>Walkways must be accessible and <b>negotiable</b> for all users.</i>                    |
| <b><u>panel</u></b>         | Decorate with panels.<br><i>A control <b>panel</b>.</i>  |
