Definitions of "Discusses" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “discusses” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *To consider or examine in speech or writing.*
- *Speak with others about (something); talk (something) over in detail; have a discussion.*



Synonyms of "Discusses" as a verb (4 Words)

- discourse** Engage in conversation.
*She could **discourse** at great length on the history of Europe.*
- hash out** Chop up.
- talk about** Express in speech.
- talk over** Use language.



Usage Examples of "Discusses" as a verb

- *We discussed our household budget.*
- *The class discussed Dante's `Inferno.*



Associations of "Discusses" (30 Words)

chat

Songbirds having a chattering call.

*She **chatted** to her mother on the phone every day.*

communication

The successful conveying or sharing of ideas and feelings.

*A **communications** network.*

conciliator

Someone who tries to bring peace.

*He was seen as a **conciliator** who would heal divisions in the party.*

confabulate

Fabricate imaginary experiences as compensation for loss of memory.

*She could be heard on the telephone **confabulating** with someone.*

confer

Have a conference in order to talk something over.

*We **conferred** about a plan of action.*

conference

Take part in a conference or conference call.

*He gathered all the men around the baize table for a **conference**.*

consult	An act of consulting a professional a consultation. <i>If you consult a solicitor making a will is a simple procedure.</i>
<u>contention</u>	A point asserted as part of an argument. <i>The teams were in fierce contention for first place.</i>
contentiousness	An inclination to be quarrelsome and contentious.
contributor	Someone who contributes (or promises to contribute) a sum of money. <i>He became a regular contributor to the magazine.</i>
<u>controversial</u>	Giving rise or likely to give rise to controversy or public disagreement. <i>Years of wrangling over a controversial bypass.</i>
<u>controversy</u>	Prolonged public disagreement or heated discussion. <i>The design of the building has caused controversy.</i>
<u>counsel</u>	Advice, especially that given formally. <i>The lawyer counselled me when I was accused of tax fraud.</i>
debate	Have an argument about something. <i>There has been much debate about prices.</i>
<u>dialogue</u>	Provide a film or play with a dialogue. <i>Passages of dialogue.</i>
<u>discourse</u>	Speak or write authoritatively about a topic. <i>The language of political discourse.</i>
discussion	A detailed treatment of a topic in speech or writing. <i>The book contains an excellent discussion of modal logic.</i>
disputation	Formal academic debate. <i>Scholastic disputations.</i>
dispute	Resist (a landing or advance). <i>The accusations are not disputed.</i>
<u>enthuse</u>	Cause to feel enthusiasm. <i>Public art is a tonic that can enthuse alienated youth.</i>
forum	A court or tribunal. <i>We hope these pages act as a forum for debate.</i>
hassel	Norwegian chemist noted for his research on organic molecules (1897-1981).
interlocutor	A person who takes part in a conversation.
<u>negotiable</u>	(of a route) able to be traversed; passable. <i>Walkways must be accessible and negotiable for all users.</i>
<u>panel</u>	Decorate with panels. <i>A control panel.</i>

parley	A negotiation between enemies. <i>They disagreed over whether to parley with the enemy.</i>
polemical	Of or involving dispute or controversy. <i>A polemical essay.</i>
prompting	Persuasion formulated as a suggestion. <i>After some prompting the defendant gave the police his name.</i>
quarrel	Take exception to or disagree with (something). <i>He will quarrel like hell if he see black pods on the trees.</i>
talk	Discussion talk about is a less formal alternative for discussion of. <i>Be careful his secretary talks.</i>
