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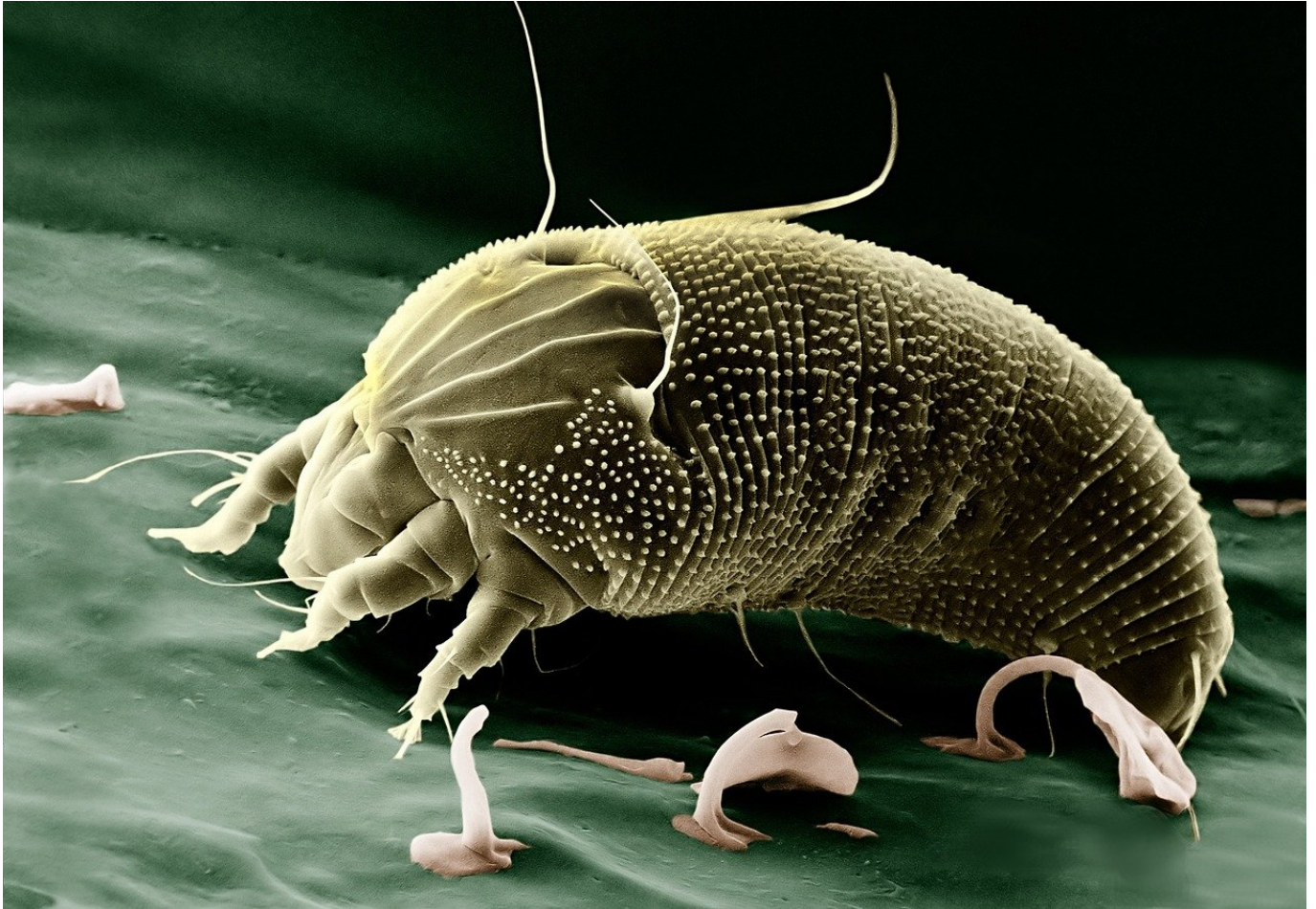

Diseased as an Adjective

Definitions of "Diseased" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “diseased” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Caused by or altered by or manifesting disease or pathology.*
- *Suffering from disease.*
- *Abnormal and corrupt.*



Synonyms of "Diseased" as an adjective (19 Words)

- abnormal** Deviating from what is normal or usual, typically in a way that is undesirable or worrying.
*They were heartbroken when they learned their child was **abnormal**.*
- ailing** Somewhat ill or prone to illness.
*The **ailing** economy.*
- bad** Feeling physical discomfort or pain though is occasionally used colloquially for bad.
*She feels **bad** about ending their engagement.*
- blighted** Affected by blight; anything that mars or prevents growth or prosperity.
***Blighted** urban districts.*
- contaminated** Corrupted by contact or association.
*Had to boil the **contaminated** water.*

<u>ill</u>	Presaging ill fortune P B Shelley. <i>A bird of ill omen.</i>
infected	Affected with a virus. <i>The bacteria can get into a crop from an infected water supply.</i>
infirm	(of a person or their judgement) weak; irresolute. <i>Elderly and infirm people.</i>
<u>morbid</u>	Suggesting the horror of death and decay. <i>Morbid interest in death.</i>
pathologic	Caused by or altered by or manifesting disease or pathology. <i>Pathological laboratory.</i>
pathological	Caused by or evidencing a mentally disturbed condition. <i>A pathological gambler.</i>
<u>rotten</u>	Damaged by decay; hence unsound and useless. <i>Rotten eggs.</i>
septic	Denoting a drainage system incorporating a septic tank. <i>Severely septic patients.</i>
sick	Excellent. <i>Sick of it all.</i>
<u>sickly</u>	(of a flavour, smell, colour, etc.) unpleasant in a way that induces discomfort or nausea. <i>A sickly vaporous swamp.</i>
<u>unhealthy</u>	Not in or exhibiting good health in body or mind. <i>An unhealthy diet of fast foods.</i>
<u>unsound</u>	Physically unsound or diseased. <i>The tower is structurally unsound.</i>
unwell	Ill. <i>He was admitted to hospital for tests after feeling unwell.</i>
unwholesome	Detrimental to physical or moral well-being. <i>The use of the living room as sleeping quarters led to unwholesome crowding.</i>
