Associations of "Disenfranchisement" (30 Words)

buccaneer	Live like a buccaneer. <i>The marauding buccaneers who used to terrorize the Mediterranean coasts.</i>
confiscate	Surrendered as a penalty. <i>The government confiscated his property early in the war.</i>
corruption	Inducement (as of a public official) by improper means (as bribery) to violate duty (as by committing a felony). <i>The term hobgoblin is thought to be a corruption of Robgoblin.</i>
decayed	Damaged by decay; hence unsound and useless. <i>Decayed teeth.</i>
depravity	A corrupt or depraved or degenerate act or practice. <i>Its brothels its opium parlors its depravity.</i>
deprive	Prevent (a person or place) from having or using something. <i>The city was deprived of its water supplies.</i>
despoil	Steal or violently remove valuable possessions from; plunder. <i>The church was despoiled of its marble wall covering.</i>
foul	Commit a foul break the rules. <i>It sometimes becomes advantageous to anchor during the periods of foul tide.</i>
impound	Seize and take legal custody of (something, especially a vehicle, goods, or documents) because of an infringement of a law. <i>The customs agents impounded the illegal shipment.</i>
impoverish	Exhaust the strength or vitality of. <i>The wars had impoverished him.</i>
loot	Steal (goods) in a war, riot, etc. <i>The gang escaped with their loot.</i>
malodorous	Smelling very unpleasant. <i>Leaking taps and malodorous drains.</i>

marauder	Someone who attacks in search of booty. <i>A band of English marauders were surprised and overcome.</i>
pillage	Goods or money obtained illegally. <i>Rebellious peasants intent on pillage.</i>
plunder	Plunder a town after capture. <i>Looters moved into the disaster area to plunder shops.</i>
putrefaction	Moral perversion; impairment of virtue and moral principles. <i>The breeze shifted and we caught the stench of putrefaction.</i>
putrid	In an advanced state of decomposition and having a foul odor. <i>The putrid smells from the slaughterhouses.</i>
rancid	(used of decomposing oils or fats) having a rank smell or taste usually due to a chemical change or decomposition. <i>Without preservatives fat goes rancid.</i>
ransack	Steal goods; take as spoils. <i>Burglars ransacked her home.</i>
rapine	The violent seizure of someone's property. <i>The fruits of violence and rapine.</i>
rob	Rip off; ask an unreasonable price. <i>Someone had robbed my jacket.</i>
rotten	Having decayed or disintegrated; usually implies foulness. <i>Rotten floor boards.</i>
steal	Steal a base. <i>At 59 95 it s an absolute steal.</i>
terrorism	The unlawful use of violence and intimidation, especially against civilians, in the pursuit of political aims. <i>The fight against terrorism.</i>
theft	The act of taking something from someone unlawfully. <i>He was convicted of theft.</i>
thieve	Take by theft. <i>The students have been thieving my favourite art books.</i>
underhand	Slyly and secretly- John Donne- C.G.Bowers. <i>Mean revenge committed underhand.</i>
unemployed	People who are involuntarily out of work (considered as a group). <i>A training programme for the long term unemployed.</i>
usurp	Take the place of. <i>The Hanoverian dynasty had usurped the Stuarts.</i>

venal

Capable of being corrupted.
