#### Synonyms of "Disgruntled" as an adjective (9 Words)

aggrieved	Feeling resentment at having been unfairly treated. They were <b>aggrieved</b> at the outcome.
disaffected	Dissatisfied, especially with people in authority or a system of control. <i>A military plot by</i> <b>disaffected</b> <i>elements in the army.</i>
disappointed	Disappointingly unsuccessful. I m <b>disappointed</b> in you Mary.
discontented	Showing or experiencing dissatisfaction or restless longing. I am so <b>discontented</b> with my work.
<u>displeased</u>	Not pleased; experiencing or manifesting displeasure. <i>He was <b>displeased</b> with your work.</i>



<u>dissatisfied</u>	Not content or happy with something. <i>Dissatisfied</i> customers.
malcontent	Discontented as toward authority. The <b>malcontent</b> generals saw their role as leaders of this counter revolution.
<u>resentful</u>	Full of or marked by resentment or indignant ill will. <b>Resentful</b> at the way he was treated.
unhappy	Unfortunate. Many were <b>unhappy</b> about the scale of the cuts.

insufferable	Having or showing unbearable arrogance or conceit. An <b>insufferable</b> bully.	
intolerable	Incapable of being put up with. The <b>intolerable</b> pressures of his work.	
malcontent	A person who is dissatisfied and rebellious. The <b>malcontent</b> generals saw their role as leaders of this counter revolution.	
objectionable	Causing disapproval or protest. A vulgar and <b>objectionable</b> person.	
offensive	Morally offensive. An impending military <b>offensive</b> against the guerrillas.	
<u>outrageous</u>	Grossly offensive to decency or morality; causing horror. The <b>outrageous</b> claims made by the previous government.	
<u>pessimist</u>	A person who tends to see the worst aspect of things or believe that the worst will happen. <i>He finds solace in the writings of</i> <b>pessimist</b> <i>philosophers.</i>	
prohibition	The period from 1920 to 1933 when the sale of alcoholic beverages was prohibited in the United States by a constitutional amendment. In 1920 the 18th amendment to the Constitution established <b>prohibition</b> in the US.	
<u>taboo</u>	Place under a taboo. Many <b>taboo</b> s have developed around physical exposure.	
unacceptable	Not satisfactory or allowable. The following use of access was judged <b>unacceptable</b> by a panel of linguists You can access your cash at any of 300 automatic tellers.	
<u>unbearable</u>	Not able to be endured or tolerated. <i>The heat was getting <b>unbearable</b></i> .	
unendurable	Incapable of being tolerated or endured. Cries of <b>unendurable</b> suffering.	
unhappy	Not happy. Had an <b>unhappy</b> time at school.	
unimaginable	Totally unlikely. Lives of almost <b>unimaginable</b> deprivation.	
<u>unpalatable</u>	Not pleasant or acceptable to the taste or mind. <i>Unpalatable truths</i> .	
<u>unsatisfactory</u>	Not giving satisfaction. Years of living in <b>unsatisfactory</b> rented accommodation.	



<u>unsatisfied</u>	Not having been satisfied. <i>The compromise left all sides</i> <b>unsatisfied</b> .
<u>unsavory</u>	Morally offensive. An <b>unsavory</b> scandal.
unsupportable	Not able to be supported or defended.
<u>unthinkable</u>	Incapable of being conceived or considered. The <b>unthinkable</b> happened I spoke up.
