Synonyms of "Disheartened" as an adjective (21 Words)

crestfallen	Sad and disappointed. <i>He came back empty handed and crestfallen.</i>
<u>crushed</u>	Treated so as to have a permanently wrinkled appearance. <i>I was crushed was I not good enough.</i>
daunted	Caused to show discomposure.
dejected	Affected or marked by low spirits. <i>Is dejected but trying to look cheerful.</i>
demoralised	Made less hopeful or enthusiastic.
demoralized	Having lost confidence or hope; disheartened. <i>Desperate demoralized people looking for work.</i>

depressed	Filled with melancholy and despondency. <i>Depressed by the loss of his job.</i>
despondent	In low spirits from loss of hope or courage. <i>She grew more and more despondent.</i>
disappointed	Sad or displeased because someone or something has failed to fulfil one's hopes or expectations. <i>The rising was a revolution of disappointed hopes.</i>
disconsolate	Sad beyond comforting; incapable of being consoled. <i>A disconsolate winter landscape.</i>
discouraged	Made less hopeful or enthusiastic. <i>He must be feeling pretty discouraged.</i>
dismayed	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
dispirited	Filled with melancholy and despondency. <i>She was determined to appear unworried in front of her dispirited family.</i>
down	Denoting a flavour variety of stable quark having relatively low mass and an electric charge of $-\frac{1}{3}$. In the Standard Model protons and neutrons are composed of up and down quarks. <i>Two down in the bottom of the ninth.</i>
downhearted	Discouraged; in low spirits. <i>Fans must not be downhearted even though we lost.</i>
low	Below average in amount extent or intensity. <i>A lowly parish priest.</i>
low-spirited	Filled with melancholy and despondency.
shaken	Disturbed psychologically as if by a physical jolt or shock. <i>The accident left her badly shaken.</i>
thrown	Caused to fall to the ground. <i>Thrown silk is raw silk that has been twisted and doubled into yarn.</i>
unmanned	Not having or needing a crew or staff. <i>An unmanned satellite to Mars.</i>
unnerved	Deprived of courage and strength. <i>The steeplejack exhausted and unnerved couldn't hold on to his dangerous perch much longer.</i>
