### Synonyms of "Disheartened" as an adjective (21 Words)

<b>crestfallen</b>	Sad and disappointed. <i>He came back empty handed and <b>crestfallen</b>.</i>
<b><u>crushed</u></b>	Treated so as to have a permanently wrinkled appearance. <i>I was <b>crushed</b> was I not good enough.</i>
<b>daunted</b>	Caused to show discomposure.
<b>dejected</b>	Affected or marked by low spirits. <i>Is <b>dejected</b> but trying to look cheerful.</i>
<b>demoralised</b>	Made less hopeful or enthusiastic.
<b>demoralized</b>	Having lost confidence or hope; disheartened. <i>Desperate <b>demoralized</b> people looking for work.</i>

<b>depressed</b>	Filled with melancholy and despondency. <i><b>Depressed</b> by the loss of his job.</i>
<b>despondent</b>	In low spirits from loss of hope or courage. <i>She grew more and more <b>despondent</b>.</i>
<b>disappointed</b>	Sad or displeased because someone or something has failed to fulfil one's hopes or expectations. <i>The rising was a revolution of <b>disappointed</b> hopes.</i>
<b>disconsolate</b>	Sad beyond comforting; incapable of being consoled. <i>A <b>disconsolate</b> winter landscape.</i>
<b>discouraged</b>	Made less hopeful or enthusiastic. <i>He must be feeling pretty <b>discouraged</b>.</i>
<b>dismayed</b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<b>dispirited</b>	Filled with melancholy and despondency. <i>She was determined to appear unworried in front of her <b>dispirited</b> family.</i>
<b>down</b>	Denoting a flavour variety of stable quark having relatively low mass and an electric charge of $1/3$ In the Standard Model protons and neutrons are composed of up and down quarks. <i>Two <b>down</b> in the bottom of the ninth.</i>
<b>downhearted</b>	Discouraged; in low spirits. <i>Fans must not be <b>downhearted</b> even though we lost.</i>
<b>low</b>	Below average in amount extent or intensity. <i>A <b>lowly</b> parish priest.</i>
<b>low-spirited</b>	Filled with melancholy and despondency.
<b>shaken</b>	Disturbed psychologically as if by a physical jolt or shock. <i>The accident left her badly <b>shaken</b>.</i>
<b>thrown</b>	Caused to fall to the ground. <i><b>Thrown</b> silk is raw silk that has been twisted and doubled into yarn.</i>
<b>unmanned</b>	Not having or needing a crew or staff. <i>An <b>unmanned</b> satellite to Mars.</i>
<b>unnerved</b>	Deprived of courage and strength. <i>The steeplejack exhausted and <b>unnerved</b> couldn't hold on to his dangerous perch much longer.</i>
