
## **Disillusionment as a Noun**

# Associations of "Disillusionment" (30 Words)

<u>begrudge</u>	Give reluctantly or resentfully. She <b>begrudge</b> d Martin his affluence.
bitterly	Extremely and sharply. The two governments quarrelled <b>bitterly</b> over the terms of the loan.
creak	A squeaking sound. The garden gate <b>creak</b> ed open.
cry	Bring into a particular state by crying. This situation is <b>cry</b> ing for attention.



disappoint	Fail to meet the hopes or expectations of. The governing coalition had bitterly <b>disappoint</b> ed the hopes of its voters.
disappointed	(of hopes or expectations) prevented from being realized. <b>Disappointed</b> expectations and thwarted ambitions.
<u>disappointing</u>	Failing to fulfil someone's hopes or expectations. It was <b>disappointing</b> that there were relatively few possibilities.
<u>disillusioned</u>	Freed from illusion. The minority groups were completely <b>disillusioned</b> with the party.
<u>dreamer</u>	Someone guided more by ideals than by practical considerations. A rebellious young <b>dreamer</b> .
embitter	Cause to be bitter or resentful. <i>He didn t let illness and divorce <b>embitter</b> him.</i>
envy	A person or thing that inspires envy. France has a film industry that is the <b>envy</b> of Europe.
gripe	Secure a boat with gripes. My only <b>gripe</b> is the size of the page numbers.
grouse	Hunt grouse.
idealist	A person who believes in the theory of idealism. <i>Hegel described himself as an absolute <b>idealist</b>.</i>
interference	The fading or disturbance of received radio signals caused by unwanted signals from other sources, such as unshielded electrical equipment, or broadcasts from other stations or channels. An unwarranted <b>interference</b> with personal liberty.
jealousy	A feeling of jealous envy (especially of a rival. Cherish their official political freedom with fierce <b>jealousy</b> .
<u>poignant</u>	Arousing affect. <b>Poignant</b> anxiety.
pout	A pouting expression. His lower lip protruded in a sulky <b>pout</b> .
rankle	(of a wound or sore) continue to be painful; fester. <i>The injustice <b>rankle</b>d her.</i>
<u>resent</u>	Wish ill or allow unwillingly. She <b>resent</b> s being paid less than her co workers.
sniffle	Sniff slightly or repeatedly, typically because of a cold or fit of crying. <i>He was restraining his <b>sniffle</b>s rather well.</i>
snivel	An act or sound of snivelling. Lucy s torrent of howls weakened to a <b>snivel</b> .



squawk	The noise of squawking. The geese flew upriver <b>squawk</b> ing.
strife	Angry or bitter disagreement over fundamental issues; conflict. <i>Decades of civil strife</i> .
sulk	A period of sulking. He was <b>sulk</b> ing over the break up of his band.
sulky	Moving slowly. Disappointment was making her <b>sulky</b> .
unsatisfactory	Not satisfactory; not good enough. Her performance proved to be <b>unsatisfactory</b> .
<u>weep</u>	A fit or period of weeping. Sit down and have a <b>weep</b> .
<u>whimper</u>	A whimpering sound. Their first appearance in the top flight ended with a <b>whimper</b> rather than a bang.
whine	Move with a whining sound. The dog <b>whine</b> d and scratched at the back door.
