<b>confused</b>	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>A <b>confused</b> expression crossed her face.</i>
<b>disconnected</b>	Music marked by or composed of disconnected parts or sounds cut short crisply. <i><b>Disconnected</b> fragments of a story.</i>

<b>discontinuous</b>	Having intervals or gaps. <i>The landscape was a <b>discontinuous</b> mosaic of fields and forest areas.</i>
<b>dislocated</b>	Separated at the joint. <i>A <b>dislocated</b> knee.</i>
<b>disordered</b>	Not arranged in order. <i>She went to comb her <b>disordered</b> hair.</i>
<b>disorganized</b>	Unable to plan one's activities efficiently. <i>She s very muddled and <b>disorganized</b>.</i>
<b>disunited</b>	Having been divided; having the unity destroyed-Samuel Lubell- E.B.White. <i>A league of <b>disunited</b> nations.</i>
<b>erratic</b>	Likely to perform unpredictably- Osbert Lancaster. <i>Her breathing was <b>erratic</b>.</i>
<b>fitful</b>	Active or occurring spasmodically or intermittently; not regular or steady. <i><b>Fitful</b> bursts of energy.</i>
<b>fragmentary</b>	Consisting of small disconnected parts. <i>Excavations have revealed <b>fragmentary</b> remains of masonry.</i>
<b>fragmented</b>	Having been divided; having the unity destroyed. <i>A <b>fragmented</b> coalition.</i>
<b>garbled</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>I got a <b>garbled</b> set of directions.</i>
<b>illogical</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>An <b>illogical</b> fear of the supernatural.</i>
<b>incoherent</b>	Of waves having no stable definite or stable phase relation. <i>He was <b>incoherent</b> with sentiment.</i>
<b>jumbled</b>	In utter disorder.
<b>mixed up</b>	Involving or composed of different races.
<b>muddled</b>	Not clear or coherent; confused. <i>Such a view reflects <b>muddled</b> thinking.</i>
<b>patchy</b>	Existing or happening in small, isolated areas. <i>A <b>patchy</b> essay.</i>
<b>piecemeal</b>	Characterized by unsystematic partial measures taken over a period of time. <i>The village is slowly being killed off by <b>piecemeal</b> development.</i>
<b>scattered</b>	Occurring or found at intervals or various locations rather than all together. <i><b>Scattered</b> villages.</i>

<b>scrappy</b>	Full of fighting spirit. <i><b>Scrappy</b> lecture notes piled up unread.</i>
<b>separated</b>	Separated at the joint. <i>A <b>separated</b> shoulder.</i>
<b>spasmodic</b>	Occurring or done in brief, irregular bursts. <i><b>Spasmodic</b> fighting continued.</i>
<b>unconnected</b>	Not joined or linked together. <i>Two <b>unconnected</b> events.</i>

## Associations of "Disjointed" (30 Words)

<b><u>amorphous</u></b>	Lacking the system or structure characteristic of living bodies. <i>An <b>amorphous</b> and leaderless legislature.</i>
<b><u>apart</u></b>	Used after a noun to indicate that someone or something has qualities which mark them out from other people or things. <i>Alaska <b>apart</b> much of America's energy business concentrates on producing gas.</i>
<b>avulsion</b>	A forcible tearing or surgical separation of one body part from another.
<b>babbling</b>	The continuous murmuring sound of flowing water. <i>The constant <b>babbling</b> of the kids.</i>
<b>detached</b>	Showing lack of emotional involvement- J.S.Perelman. <i>The <b>detached</b> shutter fell on him.</i>
<b>dichotomous</b>	Divided or dividing into two sharply distinguished parts or classifications. <i>A <b>dichotomous</b> view of the world.</i>
<b>disordered</b>	Thrown into a state of disarray or confusion. <i>The small <b>disordered</b> room.</i>
<b><u>disorganized</u></b>	Unable to plan one's activities efficiently. <i>A thousand pages of muddy and <b>disorganized</b> prose.</i>
<b><u>dispersion</u></b>	A mixture of one substance dispersed in another medium. <i>The virus is transmitted in the <b>dispersion</b> of droplets which results from sneezing or coughing.</i>

<b>distributed</b>	Spread out or scattered about or divided up. <i>The <b>distributed</b> supplies are meticulously monitored to make sure everyone gets their share.</i>
<b>garbled</b>	(of a message, sound, or transmission) confused and distorted; unclear. <i>I got a <b>garbled</b> set of directions.</i>
<b>gibber</b>	Speak rapidly and unintelligibly, typically through fear or shock. <i>They shrieked and <b>gibbered</b> as flames surrounded them.</i>
<b>illogical</b>	Lacking in correct logical relation. <i>An <b>illogical</b> fear of the supernatural.</i>
<b>incoherent</b>	Not logical or internally consistent. <i>He screamed some <b>incoherent</b> threat.</i>
<b>intersperse</b>	Scatter among or between other things; place here and there. <i>The debate was <b>interspersed</b> with angry exchanges.</i>
<b>irrational</b>	An irrational number or quantity a surd. <i><b>Irrational</b> animals.</i>
<b>jumble</b>	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>The books were in a chaotic <b>jumble</b>.</i>
<b>muddle</b>	Bring into a disordered or confusing state. <i>She was able to cut through confusion and <b>muddle</b>.</i>
<b>oasis</b>	A type of rigid foam into which the stems of flowers can be secured in flower arranging. <i>The park is an <b>oasis</b> of calm in the centre of the city.</i>
<b>opaque</b>	A substance for producing opaque areas on negatives. <i><b>Opaque</b> to X rays.</i>
<b>partition</b>	Divide a room into smaller rooms or areas by erecting partitions. <i><b>Partition</b> chromatography.</i>
<b>scattered</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i><b>Scattered</b> showers.</i>
<b>separate</b>	A garment that can be purchased separately and worn in combinations with other garments. <i>He <b>separated</b> the fighting children.</i>
<b>separated</b>	Separated at the joint. <i>His parents are <b>separated</b>.</i>
<b>spreading</b>	The opening of a subject to widespread discussion and debate.
<b>throughout</b>	Used to refer to cited works. <i>The house is in good order <b>throughout</b>.</i>

**unlike** Not equal in amount.  
*They distributed **unlike** or unequal sums to the various charities.*

**unreasonable** Beyond normal limits.  
*An **unreasonable** request.*

**widespread** Widely circulated or diffused.  
***Widespread** fear of nuclear war.*
