bitty	Tiny. <i>The text is rather bitty.</i>
confused	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>A confused expression crossed her face.</i>
disconnected	Music marked by or composed of disconnected parts or sounds cut short crisply. <i>Disconnected fragments of a story.</i>

discontinuous	Having intervals or gaps. <i>The landscape was a discontinuous mosaic of fields and forest areas.</i>
dislocated	Separated at the joint. <i>A dislocated knee.</i>
disordered	Not arranged in order. <i>She went to comb her disordered hair.</i>
<u>disorganized</u>	Unable to plan one's activities efficiently. <i>She s very muddled and disorganized.</i>
disunited	Having been divided; having the unity destroyed-Samuel Lubell- E.B.White. <i>A league of disunited nations.</i>
<u>erratic</u>	Likely to perform unpredictably- Osbert Lancaster. <i>Her breathing was erratic.</i>
fitful	Active or occurring spasmodically or intermittently; not regular or steady. <i>Fitful bursts of energy.</i>
fragmentary	Consisting of small disconnected parts. <i>Excavations have revealed fragmentary remains of masonry.</i>
fragmented	Having been divided; having the unity destroyed. <i>A fragmented coalition.</i>
garbled	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>I got a garbled set of directions.</i>
illogical	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>An illogical fear of the supernatural.</i>
<u>incoherent</u>	Of waves having no stable definite or stable phase relation. <i>He was incoherent with sentiment.</i>
jumbled	In utter disorder.
mixed up	Involving or composed of different races.
muddled	Not clear or coherent; confused. <i>Such a view reflects muddled thinking.</i>
patchy	Existing or happening in small, isolated areas. <i>A patchy essay.</i>
piecemeal	Characterized by unsystematic partial measures taken over a period of time. <i>The village is slowly being killed off by piecemeal development.</i>
scattered	Occurring or found at intervals or various locations rather than all together. <i>Scattered villages.</i>

scrappy	Full of fighting spirit. <i>Scrappy lecture notes piled up unread.</i>
separated	Separated at the joint. <i>A separated shoulder.</i>
spasmodic	Occurring or done in brief, irregular bursts. <i>Spasmodic fighting continued.</i>
unconnected	Not joined or linked together. <i>Two unconnected events.</i>

<u>amorphous</u>	Lacking the system or structure characteristic of living bodies. <i>An amorphous and leaderless legislature.</i>
<u>apart</u>	Used after a noun to indicate that someone or something has qualities which mark them out from other people or things. <i>Alaska apart much of America's energy business concentrates on producing gas.</i>
avulsion	A forcible tearing or surgical separation of one body part from another.
babbling	The continuous murmuring sound of flowing water. <i>The constant babbling of the kids.</i>
detached	Showing lack of emotional involvement- J.S.Perelman. <i>The detached shutter fell on him.</i>
dichotomous	Divided or dividing into two sharply distinguished parts or classifications. <i>A dichotomous view of the world.</i>
disordered	Thrown into a state of disarray or confusion. <i>The small disordered room.</i>
<u>disorganized</u>	Unable to plan one's activities efficiently. <i>A thousand pages of muddy and disorganized prose.</i>
<u>dispersion</u>	A mixture of one substance dispersed in another medium. <i>The virus is transmitted in the dispersion of droplets which results from sneezing or coughing.</i>

distributed	Spread out or scattered about or divided up. <i>The distributed supplies are meticulously monitored to make sure everyone gets their share.</i>
garbled	(of a message, sound, or transmission) confused and distorted; unclear. <i>I got a garbled set of directions.</i>
gibber	Speak rapidly and unintelligibly, typically through fear or shock. <i>They shrieked and gibbered as flames surrounded them.</i>
illogical	Lacking in correct logical relation. <i>An illogical fear of the supernatural.</i>
incoherent	Not logical or internally consistent. <i>He screamed some incoherent threat.</i>
intersperse	Scatter among or between other things; place here and there. <i>The debate was interspersed with angry exchanges.</i>
irrational	An irrational number or quantity a surd. <i>Irrational animals.</i>
jumble	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>The books were in a chaotic jumble.</i>
muddle	Bring into a disordered or confusing state. <i>She was able to cut through confusion and muddle.</i>
oasis	A type of rigid foam into which the stems of flowers can be secured in flower arranging. <i>The park is an oasis of calm in the centre of the city.</i>
opaque	A substance for producing opaque areas on negatives. <i>Opaque to X rays.</i>
partition	Divide a room into smaller rooms or areas by erecting partitions. <i>Partition chromatography.</i>
scattered	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>Scattered showers.</i>
separate	A garment that can be purchased separately and worn in combinations with other garments. <i>He separated the fighting children.</i>
separated	Separated at the joint. <i>His parents are separated.</i>
spreading	The opening of a subject to widespread discussion and debate.
throughout	Used to refer to cited works. <i>The house is in good order throughout.</i>

unintelligible Hard or impossible to understand.
***Unintelligible** speech.*

unlike Not equal in amount.
*They distributed **unlike** or unequal sums to the various charities.*

unreasonable Beyond normal limits.
*An **unreasonable** request.*

widespread Widely circulated or diffused.
***Widespread** fear of nuclear war.*
