### **Definitions of "Dismayed" as an adjective**

### Synonyms of "Dismayed" as an adjective (3 Words)

**aghast** Filled with horror or shock.  
*She winced **aghast** at his cruelty.*

**appalled** Greatly dismayed or horrified.  
*I am absolutely **appalled** that anyone should be attacked in this manner.*

**shocked** Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.



## Associations of "Dismayed" (30 Words)

- abominable** Very bad; terrible.  
*The uprising was suppressed with **abominable** cruelty.*
- afraid** Filled with regret or concern; used often to soften an unpleasant statement.  
***Afraid** even to turn his head.*
- aghast** Filled with horror or shock.  
*She winced **aghast** at his cruelty.*
- alarmed** Experiencing a sudden sense of danger.
- amazed** Greatly surprised; astonished.  
*She shook her head in **amazed** disbelief.*
- astonished** Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.  
*I stood enthralled **astonished** by the vastness and majesty of the cathedral.*

<b>astounded</b>	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i><b>Astounded</b> viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.</i>
<b>bemuse</b>	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone). <i>He was <b>bemused</b> by what was happening.</i>
<b>bemused</b>	Perplexed by many conflicting situations or statements; filled with bewilderment. <i>A crowd of <b>bemused</b> onlookers.</i>
<b>bewildered</b>	Perplexed and confused; very puzzled. <i>He saw the <b>bewildered</b> look on my face.</i>
<b>complicated</b>	Consisting of many interconnecting parts or elements; intricate. <i><b>Complicated</b> Middle East politics.</i>
<b>confused</b>	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. <i>A <b>confused</b> expression crossed her face.</i>
<b>disorganized</b>	Unable to plan one's activities efficiently. <i>She s very muddled and <b>disorganized</b>.</i>
<b>fearful</b>	Extremely distressing. <i><b>Fearful</b> slum conditions.</i>
<b>flabbergasted</b>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>This news has left me totally <b>flabbergasted</b>.</i>
<b>formidable</b>	Inspiring fear- G.H.Johnston. <i>The <b>formidable</b> army of brains at the Prime Minister s disposal.</i>
<b>illusive</b>	Based on or having the nature of an illusion. <i><b>Illusive</b> hopes of finding a better job.</i>
<b>loon</b>	Large somewhat primitive fish-eating diving bird of the northern hemisphere having webbed feet placed far back; related to the grebes. <i>If only she weren t such a lovesick <b>loon</b>.</i>
<b>melee</b>	A confused crowd of people. <i>The <b>melee</b> of people that were always thronging the streets.</i>
<b>mistakenly</b>	In a mistaken way; wrongly. <i>Warplanes <b>mistakenly</b> bombed a village.</i>
<b>perplexed</b>	Completely baffled; very puzzled. <i><b>Perplexed</b> language.</i>
<b>perplexing</b>	Completely baffling; very puzzling. <i><b>Perplexing</b> to someone who knew nothing about it.</i>
<b>puzzled</b>	Unable to understand; perplexed. <i><b>Puzzled</b> that she left without saying goodbye.</i>

<b>scared</b>	Made afraid. <i>I m <b>scared</b> stiff of flying.</i>
<b><u>shattered</u></b>	Exhausted. <i>Our <b>shattered</b> dreams of peace and prosperity.</i>
<b><u>shocked</u></b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<b><u>startled</u></b>	Feeling or showing sudden shock or alarm. <i>Her <b>startled</b> expression.</i>
<b>surprise</b>	Cause to be surprised. <i>Joe was <b>surprised</b> that he enjoyed the journey.</i>
<b>surprised</b>	Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. <i>A <b>surprised</b> expression.</i>
<b><u>vertigo</u></b>	A sensation of whirling and loss of balance, associated particularly with looking down from a great height, or caused by disease affecting the inner ear or the vestibular nerve; giddiness.
