Synonyms of "Dismayed" as an adjective (3 Words)

- aghast Filled with horror or shock. She winced aghast at his cruelty.
 appalled Greatly dismayed or horrified. I am absolutely appalled that anyone should be attacked in this manner.
- **shocked** Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.





Associations of "Dismayed" (30 Words)

abominable	Very bad; terrible. The uprising was suppressed with abominable cruelty.
<u>afraid</u>	Filled with regret or concern; used often to soften an unpleasant statement. <i>Afraid</i> even to turn his head.
aghast	Filled with horror or shock. She winced aghast at his cruelty.
<u>alarmed</u>	Experiencing a sudden sense of danger.
amazed	Greatly surprised; astonished. She shook her head in amazed disbelief.
<u>astonished</u>	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. I stood enthralled astonished by the vastness and majesty of the cathedral.



astounded	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>Astounded</i> viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.
bemuse	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone. <i>He was bemused by what was happening.</i>
<u>bemused</u>	Perplexed by many conflicting situations or statements; filled with bewilderment. A crowd of bemused onlookers.
bewildered	Perplexed and confused; very puzzled. <i>He saw the bewildered look on my face.</i>
<u>complicated</u>	Consisting of many interconnecting parts or elements; intricate. Complicated Middle East politics.
confused	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. A confused expression crossed her face.
<u>disorganized</u>	Unable to plan one's activities efficiently. She s very muddled and disorganized .
fearful	Extremely distressing. <i>Fearful</i> slum conditions.
<u>flabbergasted</u>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. This news has left me totally flabbergasted .
<u>formidable</u>	Inspiring fear- G.H.Johnston. The formidable army of brains at the Prime Minister s disposal.
illusive	Based on or having the nature of an illusion. <i>Illusive</i> hopes of finding a better job.
loon	Large somewhat primitive fish-eating diving bird of the northern hemisphere having webbed feet placed far back; related to the grebes. <i>If only she weren t such a lovesick loon.</i>
melee	A confused crowd of people. The melee of people that were always thronging the streets.
mistakenly	In a mistaken way; wrongly. Warplanes mistakenly bombed a village.
perplexed	Completely baffled; very puzzled. <i>Perplexed</i> language.
perplexing	Completely baffling; very puzzling. Perplexing to someone who knew nothing about it.
<u>puzzled</u>	Unable to understand; perplexed. Puzzled that she left without saying goodbye.



scared	Made afraid. I m scared stiff of flying.
<u>shattered</u>	Exhausted. Our shattered dreams of peace and prosperity.
<u>shocked</u>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<u>startled</u>	Feeling or showing sudden shock or alarm. <i>Her startled expression.</i>
surprise	Cause to be surprised. Joe was surprise d that he enjoyed the journey.
surprised	Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. A surprised expression.
<u>vertigo</u>	A sensation of whirling and loss of balance, associated particularly with looking down from a great height, or caused by disease affecting the inner ear or the vestibular nerve; giddiness.
