## **Disorganization as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Disorganization" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “disorganization” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A condition in which an orderly system has been disrupted.*
- *The disturbance of a systematic arrangement causing disorder and confusion.*
- *Inability to plan one's activities or affairs efficiently.*
- *Lack of proper planning and control.*

<b><u>amorphous</u></b>	Lacking a clear structure or focus. <i>An <b>amorphous</b> and leaderless legislature.</i>
<b><u>anarchy</u></b>	The organization of society on the basis of voluntary cooperation, without political institutions or hierarchical government; anarchism. <i>He must ensure public order in a country threatened with <b>anarchy</b>.</i>
<b>boisterous</b>	Noisy, energetic, and cheerful. <i>A group of <b>boisterous</b> lads.</i>
<b><u>chaotic</u></b>	Of or relating to a sensitive dependence on initial conditions. <i>The political situation was <b>chaotic</b>.</i>
<b>complex</b>	Make an atom or compound form a complex with another. <i>Two guanine bases can attach themselves to the same platinum atom forming a stable <b>complex</b>.</i>
<b>confused</b>	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>Bewildered and <b>confused</b>.</i>
<b>convolution</b>	A method of determination of the sum of two random variables by integration or summation. <i>The <b>convolutions</b> of farm policy.</i>
<b><u>disjointed</u></b>	Lacking a coherent sequence or connection. <i>A <b>disjointed</b> fowl.</i>
<b>disordered</b>	Not arranged in order. <i>She went to comb her <b>disordered</b> hair.</i>
<b>disorderly</b>	Undisciplined and unruly. <i>A <b>disorderly</b> pile of clothes.</i>

<b>distributed</b>	Shared or spread out. <i>The figures of syllogisms all have properly <b>distributed</b> middle terms.</i>
<b>dysfunctional</b>	Not operating normally or properly. <i><b>Dysfunctional</b> families.</i>
<b>eddy</b>	A circular movement of water causing a small whirlpool. <i>An <b>eddy</b> of chill air swirled into the carriage.</i>
<b>garbled</b>	(of a message, sound, or transmission) confused and distorted; unclear. <i>I got a <b>garbled</b> set of directions.</i>
<b>helical</b>	In the shape of a coil. <i><b>Helical</b> molecules.</i>
<b>illogical</b>	Lacking sense or clear, sound reasoning. <i>An <b>illogical</b> fear of the supernatural.</i>
<b>incoherent</b>	(of a person) unable to speak intelligibly. <i>He screamed some <b>incoherent</b> threat.</i>
<b>intricate</b>	Very complicated or detailed. <i><b>Intricate</b> lacework.</i>
<b>jumble</b>	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>We are collecting <b>jumble</b> for charity.</i>
<b>maelstrom</b>	A situation or state of confused movement or violent turmoil. <i>The train station was a <b>maelstrom</b> of crowds.</i>
<b>messy</b>	(of a situation) confused and difficult to deal with. <i>A child s <b>messy</b> eating habits.</i>
<b>promiscuous</b>	Demonstrating or implying an unselective approach; indiscriminate or casual. <i>Clinton was criticized for his <b>promiscuous</b> solicitation of campaign money.</i>
<b>purl</b>	Knit with a purl stitch. <i>Knit one <b>purl</b> one.</i>
<b>roil</b>	Make (a liquid) turbid or muddy by disturbing the sediment. <i>Winds <b>roil</b> these waters.</i>
<b>scattered</b>	(of a person) distracted or disorganized. <i><b>Scattered</b> showers.</i>
<b>swirl</b>	Turn in a twisting or spinning motion. <i>She emerged with a <b>swirl</b> of skirts.</i>
<b>tumultuous</b>	Making an uproar or loud, confused noise. <i><b>Tumultuous</b> applause.</i>
<b>vortex</b>	A whirling mass of fluid or air, especially a whirlpool or whirlwind. <i>A swirling <b>vortex</b> of emotions.</i>

**whirl**

Flow in a circular current, of liquids.

*Leaves **whirled** in eddies of wind.*

**whirlpool**

A turbulent situation from which it is hard to escape.

*He was drawing her down into an emotional **whirlpool**.*
