<b>incapable</b>	Not meeting requirements. <i><b>Incapable</b> of doing the work.</i>
<b>ineffective</b>	Not producing any significant or desired effect. <i>An <b>ineffective</b> administration.</i>
<b>ineffectual</b>	(of a person) lacking the ability or qualities to fulfil a role or handle a situation. <i>An <b>ineffectual</b> campaign.</i>
<b>inefficient</b>	Lacking the ability or skill to perform effectively; inadequate. <i><b>Inefficient</b> workers.</i>
<b>jumbled</b>	In utter disorder.
<b>messy</b>	Generating or involving mess. <i>Stripping wallpaper can be a <b>messy</b> time consuming job.</i>
<b>mixed up</b>	Involving or composed of different races.
<b>muddled</b>	Not clear or coherent; confused. <i>Such a view reflects <b>muddled</b> thinking.</i>
<b>random</b>	Odd, unusual, or unexpected. <i>Are you going to take some <b>random</b> guy on Twitter s word.</i>
<b>topsy-turvy</b>	In utter disorder.
<b>undisciplined</b>	Not subjected to correction or discipline. <i>The paintings were the work of an <b>undisciplined</b> talent.</i>

<b>unmethodical</b>	Not orderly and systematic. <i>The project failed through <b>unmethodical</b> planning.</i>
<b>unorganized</b>	Not affiliated in a trade union. <i><b>Unorganized</b> data.</i>
<b>unprepared</b>	Without preparation; not prepared for- R.E.Danielson. <i>Paintings on <b>unprepared</b> canvas.</i>
<b>unsystematic</b>	Not done or acting according to a fixed plan or system; unmethodical. <i><b>Unsystematic</b> and <b>fragmentary</b> records.</i>
<b>untidy</b>	Not neat and tidy. <i><b>Untidy</b> and <b>casual</b> about money.</i>

<b><u>disjointed</u></b>	Separated at the joint. <i>A <b>disjointed</b> fowl.</i>
<b>disordered</b>	Thrown into a state of disarray or confusion. <i>She went to comb her <b>disordered</b> hair.</i>
<b>disorderly</b>	Involving or contributing to a breakdown of peaceful and law-abiding behaviour. <i><b>Disorderly</b> youths.</i>
<b>distributed</b>	Shared or spread out. <i>The <b>distributed</b> supplies are meticulously monitored to make sure everyone gets their share.</i>
<b><u>dysfunctional</u></b>	(of a trait or condition) failing to serve an adjustive purpose. <i><b>Dysfunctional</b> families.</i>
<b>eddy</b>	Founder of Christian Science in 1866 (1821-1910). <i>An <b>eddy</b> of chill air swirled into the carriage.</i>
<b>garbled</b>	(of a message, sound, or transmission) confused and distorted; unclear. <i>I got a <b>garbled</b> set of directions.</i>
<b>helical</b>	In the shape of a coil. <i><b>Helical</b> molecules.</i>
<b>illogical</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>An <b>illogical</b> fear of the supernatural.</i>
<b><u>incoherent</u></b>	(of spoken or written language) expressed in an incomprehensible or confusing way; unclear. <i><b>Incoherent</b> with grief.</i>
<b>intricate</b>	Very complicated or detailed. <i><b>Intricate</b> lacework.</i>
<b>jumble</b>	Be all mixed up or jumbled together. <i>We are collecting <b>jumble</b> for charity.</i>
<b>maelstrom</b>	A powerful whirlpool in the sea or a river. <i>The train station was a <b>maelstrom</b> of crowds.</i>
<b><u>messy</u></b>	Dirty and disorderly. <i>Stripping wallpaper can be a <b>messy</b> time consuming job.</i>
<b><u>promiscuous</u></b>	Casual and unrestrained in sexual behavior. <i><b>Promiscuous</b> teenagers.</i>
<b>purl</b>	Knit with a purl stitch. <i>Knit one <b>purl</b> one.</i>
<b>roil</b>	Make (a liquid) turbid or muddy by disturbing the sediment. <i>The sea <b>roiled</b> below her.</i>

<b>scattered</b>	Occurring or found at intervals or various locations rather than all together. <i>Changes in the angular distribution of <b>scattered</b> light.</i>
<b><u>swirl</u></b>	Cause to move in a twisting or spiralling pattern. <i><b>Swirls</b> of dust swept across the floor.</i>
<b>tumultuous</b>	Characterized by unrest or disorder or insubordination. <i>The <b>tumultuous</b> years of his administration.</i>
<b>vortex</b>	The shape of something rotating rapidly. <i>We were caught in a <b>vortex</b> of water.</i>
<b><u>whirl</u></b>	Revolve quickly and repeatedly around one's own axis. <i>Kate made her way back to the office her mind <b>whirling</b>.</i>
<b>whirlpool</b>	A quickly rotating mass of water in a river or sea into which objects may be drawn, typically caused by the meeting of conflicting currents. <i>He was drawing her down into an emotional <b>whirlpool</b>.</i>
