## Disposable as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Disposable" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “disposable” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Free or available for use or disposition.*
- *Designed to be disposed of after use.*
- *(of an article) intended to be thrown away after use.*
- *(chiefly of financial assets) readily available for the owner's use as required.*
- *(of a person or idea) able to be dispensed with; easily dismissed.*



## Synonyms of "Disposable" as an adjective (11 Words)

- accessible** Capable of being reached.  
*The town is **accessible** by bus.*
- available** Convenient for use or disposal.  
*He was **available** and willing to accompany her.*
- expendable** Of relatively little significance, and therefore able to be abandoned or destroyed.  
*The region is **expendable** in the wider context of national politics.*
- inessential** Not absolutely necessary.  
***Inessential** information.*
- obtainable** Capable of being obtained.  
*Customers financial details are easily **obtainable**.*
- replaceable** Denoting those hydrogen atoms in an acid which can be displaced by metal atoms when forming salts.  
*A knife with a **replaceable** blade.*

- skippable** (of an activity, event, etc.) not worth doing or attending.  
*Why did elite men's players treat the Olympics as a **skippable** event.*
- spendable** Remaining after taxes.  
***Spendable** income.*
- throwaway** Intended to be thrown away after use.  
*A **throwaway** camera.*
- unessential** Not absolutely necessary; inessential.  
*A train has broken down resulting in a call to postpone all **unessential** travel.*
- usable** Fit or ready for use or service.  
***Usable** information.*



## Usage Examples of "Disposable" as an adjective

- *Disposable nappies.*

- *Disposable paper cups.*
- *A disposable razor.*
- *He made a mental inventory of his disposable assets.*
- *The poor performer is motivated by the fear that he or she is highly disposable.*
- *Every disposable piece of equipment was sent to the fire.*
- *Disposable assets.*



## Associations of "Disposable" (30 Words)

- bin** Store something especially wine in a bin.  
*The whole idea had to be **binned**.*
- detritus** Gravel, sand, silt, or other material produced by erosion.  
*The streets were foul with **detritus**.*
- diaper** A linen or cotton fabric woven in a repeating pattern of small diamonds.
- discard** Anything that is cast aside or discarded.  
*West led a heart and East was able to **discard** his club loser.*

<b>discarded</b>	Thrown away.
<b>disposal</b>	The action of overcoming a rival or threat. <i>Disposals of fixed and non current assets.</i>
<b>dispose</b>	Incline (someone) towards a particular activity or mood. <i>The Scottish champions were buoyant after they <b>disposed</b> of English champions Leeds.</i>
<b>dump</b>	A heap of rubbish left at a dump. <i>She <b>dumped</b> her knapsack on the floor.</i>
<b>dumping</b>	Selling goods abroad at a price below that charged in the domestic market.
<b>garbage</b>	A receptacle where waste can be discarded. <i>She tossed the moldy bread into the <b>garbage</b>.</i>
<b>incinerator</b>	A furnace for incinerating (especially to dispose of refuse).
<b>jettison</b>	The action of jettisoning something. <i>The <b>jettison</b> lever.</i>
<b>junk</b>	Junk bonds. <i>I only have an hour to get all my <b>junk</b> together.</i>
<b>landfill</b>	Waste material used in landfill sites. <i>Our reusable packaging eliminates tons of <b>landfill</b>.</i>
<b>litter</b>	Provide a horse or other animal with litter as bedding. <i>The spiders live in leaf <b>litter</b>.</i>
<b>napkin</b>	A square piece of cloth or paper used at a meal to wipe the fingers or lips and to protect garments. <i>She unfolded her <b>napkin</b> and put it on her lap.</i>
<b>recycle</b>	Convert (waste) into reusable material. <i>He reserves the right to <b>recycle</b> his own text.</i>
<b>recycling</b>	The act of processing used or abandoned materials for use in creating new products. <i>A call for the <b>recycling</b> of all paper.</i>
<b>refuse</b>	Refuse to accept. <i>He s so conceited he d never believe anyone would <b>refuse</b> him.</i>
<b>reusable</b>	An item which can be used again or more than once. <i><b>Reusable</b> shopping bags.</i>
<b>reuse</b>	The action of using something again. <i>The tape could be magnetically erased and <b>reused</b>.</i>
<b>rubble</b>	Waste or rough fragments of stone, brick, concrete, etc., especially as the debris from the demolition of buildings. <i>Two buildings collapsed trapping scores of people in the <b>rubble</b>.</i>

- scavenge** Search for discarded items or food in (a place).  
*The feral cat preferred to **scavenge** carrion from the forest floor.*
- sewage** Waste matter carried away in sewers or drains.  
**Sewage** treatment.
- squander** Spend extravagantly.  
*You **squandered** the opportunity to get an advanced degree.*
- trash** Nonsensical talk or writing.  
*She almost **trashed** the email window.*
- usable** Fit or ready for use or service.  
**Usable** information.
- waste** Run off as waste.  
*The **waste**fulness of missed opportunities.*
- wastebasket** A waste-paper basket.
