## Disposed as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Disposed" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “disposed” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(usually followed by `to')* naturally disposed toward.
- *Having made preparations.*
- *Having a specified attitude to or towards.*
- *Inclined or willing.*
- *Naturally disposed toward.*



## Synonyms of "Disposed" as an adjective (15 Words)

- apt** Mentally quick and resourceful-Bram Stoker.  
*He is **apt** to ignore matters he considers unimportant.*
- fain** Having made preparations.  
*He was **fain** to acknowledge that the agreement was sacrosanct.*
- given** Inclined or disposed to.  
***Given** the engine's condition it is a wonder that it started.*
- in the mood** Directed or bound inward.
- inclined** (often followed by `to') having a preference, disposition, or tendency.  
*An **inclined** ramp.*
- liable** Responsible by law; legally answerable.  
*Areas **liable** to flooding.*
- likely** Likely but not certain to be or become true or real.  
*A **likely** topic for investigation.*

<b>mind</b>	Interested in or enthusiastic about a particular thing. <i>Career <b>mind</b>.</i>
<b><u>predisposed</u></b>	Made susceptible. <i>Because of conditions in the mine miners are <b>predisposed</b> to lung disease.</i>
<b>prepared</b>	Equipped or prepared with necessary intellectual resources. <i>A <b>prepared</b> statement.</i>
<b><u>prone</u></b>	Denoting the position of the forearm with the palm of the hand facing downwards. <i>Farmed fish are <b>prone</b> to disease.</i>
<b>ready</b>	Apprehending and responding with speed and sensitivity. <i>I got <b>ready</b> for bed.</i>
<b><u>subject</u></b>	Possibly accepting or permitting. <i>The time is fixed by the director and players and therefore <b>subject</b> to much variation.</i>
<b>tending</b>	(usually followed by `to') naturally disposed toward.
<b><u>willing</u></b>	Given or done readily. <i><b>Willing</b> helpers.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Disposed" as an adjective

- *He is favourably disposed towards the proposals.*
- *James didn't seem disposed to take the hint.*



## Associations of "Disposed" (30 Words)

- apt** At risk of or subject to experiencing something usually unpleasant.  
*He is **apt** to be swayed by irrational considerations.*
- compliant** Having the property of compliance.  
*The conversion of the gel to a much less **compliant** rigid glass.*
- designed** Done or made or performed with purpose and intent.  
*Style is more than the deliberate and **designed** creation.*
- eager** (of a person's expression or tone of voice) keenly expectant or interested.  
*An **eager** look.*
- fain** Having made preparations.  
*He was **fain** to acknowledge that the agreement was sacrosanct.*
- given** Acknowledged as a supposition.  
*She was not often **given** to anger.*

<b>gladly</b>	With pleasure or gratitude; happily. <i>This was <b>gladly</b> agreed to.</i>
<b>happily</b>	It is fortunate that. <i>They shouted <b>happily</b>.</i>
<b>hope</b>	Be optimistic be full of hope have hopes. <i>I <b>hope</b> to have finished this work by tomorrow evening.</i>
<b>inclined</b>	At an angle to the horizontal or vertical position. <i><b>Inclined</b> to be moody.</i>
<b>likely</b>	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i><b>Likely</b> candidates for the job.</i>
<b>mind</b>	Keep in mind. <i><b>Mind</b> your head on that cupboard.</i>
<b>minded</b>	(used in combination) mentally oriented toward something specified. <i>Career <b>minded</b>.</i>
<b>obey</b>	Submit to the authority of (someone) or comply with (a law). <i>The officer was convicted for refusing to <b>obey</b> orders.</i>
<b>oriented</b>	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>The book is value <b>oriented</b> throughout.</i>
<b>partiality</b>	An inclination to favor one group or view or opinion over alternatives. <i>Miller s <b>partiality</b> for flowering shrubs is evident.</i>
<b>prepared</b>	Equipped or prepared with necessary intellectual resources. <i>The spokesman was reading a <b>prepared</b> statement.</i>
<b>prone</b>	Denoting the position of the forearm with the palm of the hand facing downwards. <i>Farmed fish are <b>prone</b> to disease.</i>
<b>ready</b>	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. <i><b>Ready</b> for use.</i>
<b>reliance</b>	Certainty based on past experience. <i>The farmer s <b>reliance</b> on pesticides.</i>
<b>sacrifice</b>	Make a sacrifice bid. <i>The goat was <b>sacrificed</b> at the shrine.</i>
<b>susceptible</b>	Likely or liable to be influenced or harmed by a particular thing. <i><b>Susceptible</b> to colds.</i>
<b>tend</b>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>Written language <b>tends</b> to be formal.</i>

- think** An act of thinking.  
*I can't **think** what her last name was.*
- thought** The formation of opinions, especially as a philosophy or system of ideas, or the opinions so formed.  
*He had given up all **thoughts** of making London his home.*
- tractable** (of a person) easy to control or influence.  
*Trying to make the mathematics **tractable**.*
- volitional** Relating to the use of one's will.  
*A **volitional** act.*
- voluntary** (of a conveyance or disposition) made without return in money or other consideration.  
*Man is a **voluntary** agent.*
- willing** Ready, eager, or prepared to do something.  
***Willing** helps.*
- willingly** In a willing manner.  
*I **willingly** accept.*
