- *Having made preparations.*
- *Having a specified attitude to or towards.*
- *Inclined or willing.*
- *Naturally disposed toward.*



Synonyms of "Disposed" as an adjective (15 Words)

apt	Mentally quick and resourceful-Bram Stoker. <i>He is apt to ignore matters he considers unimportant.</i>
fain	Having made preparations. <i>He was fain to acknowledge that the agreement was sacrosanct.</i>
given	Inclined or disposed to. <i>Given the engine's condition it is a wonder that it started.</i>
in the mood	Directed or bound inward.
inclined	(often followed by `to') having a preference, disposition, or tendency. <i>An inclined ramp.</i>
liable	Responsible by law; legally answerable. <i>Areas liable to flooding.</i>
likely	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>A likely topic for investigation.</i>

mind	Interested in or enthusiastic about a particular thing. <i>Career mind.</i>
predisposed	Made susceptible. <i>Because of conditions in the mine miners are predisposed to lung disease.</i>
prepared	Equipped or prepared with necessary intellectual resources. <i>A prepared statement.</i>
prone	Denoting the position of the forearm with the palm of the hand facing downwards. <i>Farmed fish are prone to disease.</i>
ready	Apprehending and responding with speed and sensitivity. <i>I got ready for bed.</i>
subject	Possibly accepting or permitting. <i>The time is fixed by the director and players and therefore subject to much variation.</i>
tending	(usually followed by `to') naturally disposed toward.
willing	Given or done readily. <i>Willing helpers.</i>



Usage Examples of "Disposed" as an adjective

- *He is favourably disposed towards the proposals.*
- *James didn't seem disposed to take the hint.*



Associations of "Disposed" (30 Words)

apt

At risk of or subject to experiencing something usually unpleasant.
*He is **apt** to be swayed by irrational considerations.*

compliant

Having the property of compliance.
*The conversion of the gel to a much less **compliant** rigid glass.*

designed

Done or made or performed with purpose and intent.
*Style is more than the deliberate and **designed** creation.*

eager

(of a person's expression or tone of voice) keenly expectant or interested.
*An **eager** look.*

fain

Having made preparations.
*He was **fain** to acknowledge that the agreement was sacrosanct.*

given

Acknowledged as a supposition.
*She was not often **given** to anger.*

<u>gladly</u>	With pleasure or gratitude; happily. <i>This was gladly agreed to.</i>
<u>happily</u>	It is fortunate that. <i>They shouted happily.</i>
hope	Be optimistic be full of hope have hopes. <i>I hope to have finished this work by tomorrow evening.</i>
inclined	At an angle to the horizontal or vertical position. <i>Inclined to be moody.</i>
likely	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>Likely candidates for the job.</i>
mind	Keep in mind. <i>Mind your head on that cupboard.</i>
minded	(used in combination) mentally oriented toward something specified. <i>Career minded.</i>
<u>obey</u>	Submit to the authority of (someone) or comply with (a law). <i>The officer was convicted for refusing to obey orders.</i>
oriented	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>The book is value oriented throughout.</i>
partiality	An inclination to favor one group or view or opinion over alternatives. <i>Miller s partiality for flowering shrubs is evident.</i>
prepared	Equipped or prepared with necessary intellectual resources. <i>The spokesman was reading a prepared statement.</i>
<u>prone</u>	Denoting the position of the forearm with the palm of the hand facing downwards. <i>Farmed fish are prone to disease.</i>
ready	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. <i>Ready for use.</i>
<u>reliance</u>	Certainty based on past experience. <i>The farmer s reliance on pesticides.</i>
sacrifice	Make a sacrifice bid. <i>The goat was sacrificed at the shrine.</i>
<u>susceptible</u>	Likely or liable to be influenced or harmed by a particular thing. <i>Susceptible to colds.</i>
<u>tend</u>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>Written language tends to be formal.</i>

think	An act of thinking. <i>I can't think what her last name was.</i>
thought	The formation of opinions, especially as a philosophy or system of ideas, or the opinions so formed. <i>He had given up all thoughts of making London his home.</i>
<u>tractable</u>	(of a person) easy to control or influence. <i>Trying to make the mathematics tractable.</i>
volitional	Relating to the use of one's will. <i>A volitional act.</i>
<u>voluntary</u>	(of a conveyance or disposition) made without return in money or other consideration. <i>Man is a voluntary agent.</i>
<u>willing</u>	Ready, eager, or prepared to do something. <i>Willing helps.</i>
<u>willingly</u>	In a willing manner. <i>I willingly accept.</i>
