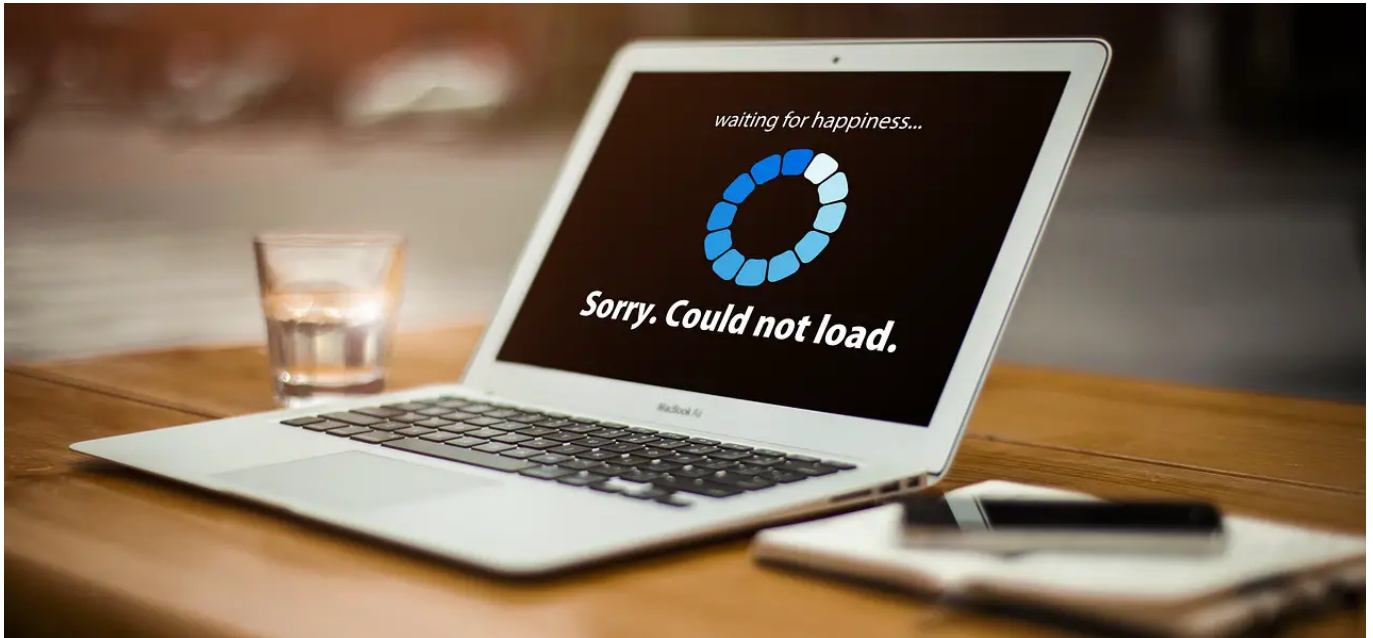

### **Definitions of "Dissatisfaction" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “dissatisfaction” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Lack of satisfaction.*
- *The feeling of being displeased and discontent.*



## Synonyms of "Dissatisfaction" as a noun (15 Words)

<b>anger</b>	Belligerence aroused by a real or supposed wrong (personified as one of the deadly sins). <i>I was seething with <b>anger</b> and frustration.</i>
<b>annoyance</b>	An unpleasant person who is annoying or exasperating. <i>The Council found him an <b>annoyance</b>.</i>
<b>disaffection</b>	A state or feeling of being dissatisfied, especially with people in authority or a system of control. <i>There is growing <b>disaffection</b> with large corporations.</i>
<b><u>disappointment</u></b>	A person or thing that causes disappointment. <i>I was a big <b>disappointment</b> to her.</i>
<b>discontent</b>	A longing for something better than the present situation. <i>The <b>discontents</b> of the working class.</i>
<b>discontentment</b>	A longing for something better than the present situation.
<b>disgruntlement</b>	A feeling of sulky discontent. <i>The survey pointed to widespread <b>disgruntlement</b> over recent pay rises.</i>
<b>disquiet</b>	A feeling of worry or unease. <i>Public <b>disquiet</b> about animal testing.</i>
<b><u>exasperation</u></b>	A feeling of intense irritation or annoyance. <i>She rolled her eyes in <b>exasperation</b>.</i>

**frustration**

The feeling of being upset or annoyed as a result of being unable to change or achieve something.

*Her constant complaints were the main source of his **frustration**.*

**irritation**

A thing that annoys or irritates someone.

*Much to my **irritation** Chris fell asleep.*

**malaise**

A general feeling of discomfort, illness, or unease whose exact cause is difficult to identify.

*A society afflicted by a deep cultural **malaise**.*

**resentment**

A feeling of deep and bitter anger and ill-will.

*Some people harbour **resentments** going back many years.*

**unhappiness**

State characterized by emotions ranging from mild discontentment to deep grief.

*Residents expressed their **unhappiness** at the council's decision.*

**vexation**

The state of being annoyed, frustrated, or worried.

*The **vexations** of life under canvas.*





## Usage Examples of "Dissatisfaction" as a noun

- *Widespread public dissatisfaction with incumbent politicians.*
- *He was never slow to express his dissatisfaction with the service he received.*
