

- Having a divided form or structure.
- Having one or more indentations reaching nearly to the midrib.
- Having been cut up for anatomical study.

adhere	Follow through or carry out a plan without deviation. Paint won t adhere well to a greasy surface.
analyze	Subject to psychoanalytic treatment. <i>Analyze</i> a chemical compound.
anatomical	An expression that relates to anatomy. <i>Anatomical features.</i>
<u>anatomy</u>	A detailed analysis. <i>He studied physiology and anatomy.</i>
autopsy	Perform an autopsy on a body or organ. On autopsy it was established that he had suffered from a rare brain condition.



break	The act of breaking something. The company has attempted to break the strike using non union labour.
<u>cadaver</u>	A corpse. The cadaver was intended for dissection.
cleave	Split or sever (something), especially along a natural line or grain. They watched a coot cleave the smooth water.
collate	To assemble in proper sequence. These accounts he collate d with his own experience.
corpse	The dead body of a human being. He believed that fascism would revive the corpse of Europe.
<u>deconstruct</u>	Analyse a text or linguistic or conceptual system by deconstruction. I want to deconstruct this myth that poverty breeds crime.
dismember	Cut off the limbs of (a person or animal. The winning powers of World War I set out to dismember the Ottoman Empire.
dissatisfy	Fail to satisfy (someone. What is it about these words that dissatisfies you?
dissection	Detailed critical analysis or examination one part at a time (as of a literary work. This dissection of modern relationships.
evaluate	Evaluate or estimate the nature quality ability extent or significance of. <i>How do you evaluate this grant proposal.</i>
examine	Question or examine thoroughly and closely. A doctor examine d me and said I might need a caesarean.
<u>fracture</u>	Sustain a fracture of a bone. The stone has fracture d.
inquest	A discussion or investigation into something that has happened, especially something undesirable. An inquest by New York newspapers into a subway fire.
moiety	Each of two parts into which a thing is or can be divided. <i>The enzyme removes the sulphate moiety.</i>
morgue	A mortuary. The cadavers were bagged and removed to the city morgue .
<u>parse</u>	An act of parsing a string or a text. A user question input is parse d into an internal conceptual representation.
partition	Divide a room into smaller rooms or areas by erecting partitions. The hall was partition ed to contain the noise of the computers.



piece	Slowly make sense of something from separate pieces of evidence. <i>He sacrificed a piece to get a strategic advantage.</i>
postmortem	An examination and dissection of a dead body to determine cause of death or the changes produced by disease. <i>The postmortem discussion of the President s TV address.</i>
rend	Wrench (something) violently. Snapping teeth that would rend human flesh to shreds.
rive	Split or tear apart violently. The wood was rive n with deep cracks.
segmentation	The act of dividing or partitioning; separation by the creation of a boundary that divides or keeps apart. The segmentation of society means that often we don t have arguments across the political divide.
sort	Resolve (a problem or difficulty. She served a creamy sort of dessert thing.
<u>split</u>	A single thickness of split hide. I could never do the split s before.
