
### Disseminate as a Verb

- Spread (something, especially information) widely.
- Spread throughout an organ or the body.
- Cause to become widely known.







### Synonyms of "Disseminate" as a verb (17 Words)

**broadcast** Broadcast over the airwaves as in radio or television.

We don t want to **broadcast** our unhappiness to the world.

**circularise** Distribute circulars to.

**circularize** Canvass by using a questionnaire.

They **circularize** prospective purchasers at regular intervals.

Move through a space, circuit or system, returning to the starting point.

**Circulate** a rumor.

**communicate** Pass on (an infectious disease) to another person or animal.

He and his sons haven t **communicate**d for years.

diffuse Spread or diffuse through.

**disperse**To cause to separate and go in different directions.

**pass around** Place into the hands or custody of.
