| <u>asunder</u> | Into parts or pieces. <i>Torn asunder.</i> |
| <u>circulate</u> | Move in circles. <i>Antibodies circulate in the bloodstream.</i> |
| <u>diffuse</u> | Spread or diffuse through. <i>The problem is how to diffuse power without creating anarchy.</i> |
| <u>diffusion</u> | The process in which there is movement of a substance from an area of high concentration of that substance to an area of lower concentration. <i>The rate of diffusion of a gas.</i> |
| <u>dispel</u> | Make (a doubt, feeling, or belief) disappear. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to dispel Elaine s dejection.</i> |
| dispersal | The splitting up of a group of people, causing them to leave in different directions. <i>Colleges had made large dispersals and the shops were filled with books.</i> |
| disperse | Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. <i>Storms can disperse seeds via high altitudes.</i> |
| dispersed | Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely dispersed friends.</i> |
| <u>dispersion</u> | The action or process of distributing things or people over a wide area. <i>The virus is transmitted in the dispersion of droplets which results from sneezing or coughing.</i> |
| dissemination | The action or fact of spreading something, especially information, widely. <i>The dissemination of public information.</i> |
| dissipate | Live a life of pleasure, especially with respect to alcoholic consumption. <i>No power is dissipated in this sort of control element.</i> |
| distribute | Cause to be distributed. <i>Information leaflets are being distributed to hotels.</i> |

| diversify | Enlarge or vary the range of products or the field of operation of (a business). <i>We re confident that the new owners will grow and diversify the company globally.</i> |
| effluence | The process of flowing out. |
| imbue | Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i> |
| intersperse | Diversify (a thing or things) with other things at intervals. <i>The debate was interspersed with angry exchanges.</i> |
| perfuse | Permeate or suffuse with a liquid, colour, or quality. <i>The transplanted kidney is perfused at low pressure by retrograde flow.</i> |
| <u>permeate</u> | Pass through. <i>The aroma of soup permeated the air.</i> |
| pervasiveness | The quality of spreading widely or being present throughout an area or a group of people. <i>The pervasiveness of violence on television.</i> |
| proliferate | (of a cell, structure, or organism) reproduce rapidly. <i>The science fiction magazines which proliferated in the 1920s.</i> |
| <u>proliferation</u> | Rapid increase in the number or amount of something. <i>A continuing threat of nuclear proliferation.</i> |
| prolix | Tediously prolonged or tending to speak or write at great length. <i>Editing a prolix manuscript.</i> |
| <u>propagate</u> | Cause to propagate as by grafting or layering. <i>Sound and light propagate in this medium.</i> |
| <u>scatter</u> | The act of scattering. <i>Scatter cards across the table.</i> |
| scattered | Occurring or found at intervals or various locations rather than all together. <i>Changes in the angular distribution of scattered light.</i> |
| <u>spray</u> | Cover by spraying with a liquid. <i>A spray of bullets.</i> |
| spread | Spread across or over. <i>The spread of the urban population into rural areas.</i> |
| <u>sprinkle</u> | The act of sprinkling or splashing water. <i>Sprinkle sesame seeds over the top.</i> |
| strew | Be scattered or spread untidily over (a surface or area). <i>A small room with newspapers strewn all over the floor.</i> |

Gradually spread through or over.
