## Associations of "Disseminated" (30 Words)

<a href="#">asunder</a>	Into parts or pieces. <i>Torn <b>asunder</b>.</i>
<a href="#">circulate</a>	Move in circles. <i>Antibodies <b>circulate</b> in the bloodstream.</i>
<a href="#">diffuse</a>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>The problem is how to <b>diffuse</b> power without creating anarchy.</i>
<a href="#">diffusion</a>	The process in which there is movement of a substance from an area of high concentration of that substance to an area of lower concentration. <i>The rate of <b>diffusion</b> of a gas.</i>
<a href="#">dispel</a>	Make (a doubt, feeling, or belief) disappear. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to <b>dispel</b> Elaine s dejection.</i>
<b>dispersal</b>	The splitting up of a group of people, causing them to leave in different directions. <i>Colleges had made large <b>dispersals</b> and the shops were filled with books.</i>
<b>disperse</b>	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. <i>Storms can <b>disperse</b> seeds via high altitudes.</i>
<b>dispersed</b>	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely <b>dispersed</b> friends.</i>
<a href="#">dispersion</a>	The action or process of distributing things or people over a wide area. <i>The virus is transmitted in the <b>dispersion</b> of droplets which results from sneezing or coughing.</i>
<b>dissemination</b>	The action or fact of spreading something, especially information, widely. <i>The <b>dissemination</b> of public information.</i>
<b>dissipate</b>	Live a life of pleasure, especially with respect to alcoholic consumption. <i>No power is <b>dissipated</b> in this sort of control element.</i>
<b>distribute</b>	Cause to be distributed. <i>Information leaflets are being <b>distributed</b> to hotels.</i>

<b>diversify</b>	Enlarge or vary the range of products or the field of operation of (a business). <i>We re confident that the new owners will grow and <b>diversify</b> the company globally.</i>
<b>effluence</b>	The process of flowing out.
<b>imbue</b>	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably <b>imbued</b> with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
<b>intersperse</b>	Diversify (a thing or things) with other things at intervals. <i>The debate was <b>interspersed</b> with angry exchanges.</i>
<b>perfuse</b>	Permeate or suffuse with a liquid, colour, or quality. <i>The transplanted kidney is <b>perfused</b> at low pressure by retrograde flow.</i>
<b><u>permeate</u></b>	Pass through. <i>The aroma of soup <b>permeated</b> the air.</i>
<b>pervasiveness</b>	The quality of spreading widely or being present throughout an area or a group of people. <i>The <b>pervasiveness</b> of violence on television.</i>
<b>proliferate</b>	(of a cell, structure, or organism) reproduce rapidly. <i>The science fiction magazines which <b>proliferated</b> in the 1920s.</i>
<b><u>proliferation</u></b>	Rapid increase in the number or amount of something. <i>A continuing threat of nuclear <b>proliferation</b>.</i>
<b>prolix</b>	Tediously prolonged or tending to speak or write at great length. <i>Editing a <b>prolix</b> manuscript.</i>
<b><u>propagate</u></b>	Cause to propagate as by grafting or layering. <i>Sound and light <b>propagate</b> in this medium.</i>
<b><u>scatter</u></b>	The act of scattering. <i><b>Scatter</b> cards across the table.</i>
<b>scattered</b>	Occurring or found at intervals or various locations rather than all together. <i>Changes in the angular distribution of <b>scattered</b> light.</i>
<b><u>spray</u></b>	Cover by spraying with a liquid. <i>A <b>spray</b> of bullets.</i>
<b>spread</b>	Spread across or over. <i>The <b>spread</b> of the urban population into rural areas.</i>
<b><u>sprinkle</u></b>	The act of sprinkling or splashing water. <i><b>Sprinkle</b> sesame seeds over the top.</i>
<b>strew</b>	Be scattered or spread untidily over (a surface or area). <i>A small room with newspapers <b>strewn</b> all over the floor.</i>

**suffuse**

Gradually spread through or over.  
*Her cheeks were **suffused** with colour.*
