Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. Has ties with many widely dispersed friends.
The action or process of distributing things or people over a wide area. The virus is transmitted in the dispersion of droplets which results from sneezing or coughing.
The action or fact of spreading something, especially information, widely. <i>The dissemination of public information.</i>
Live a life of pleasure, especially with respect to alcoholic consumption. No power is dissipate d in this sort of control element.
Cause to be distributed. Information leaflets are being distribute d to hotels.



diversify	Enlarge or vary the range of products or the field of operation of (a business. We re confident that the new owners will grow and diversify the company globally.
effluence	The process of flowing out.
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably</i> imbue <i>d with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
intersperse	Diversify (a thing or things) with other things at intervals. The debate was intersperse d with angry exchanges.
perfuse	Permeate or suffuse with a liquid, colour, or quality. The transplanted kidney is perfuse d at low pressure by retrograde flow.
<u>permeate</u>	Pass through. The aroma of soup permeate d the air.
pervasiveness	The quality of spreading widely or being present throughout an area or a group of people. The pervasiveness of violence on television.
proliferate	(of a cell, structure, or organism) reproduce rapidly. <i>The science fiction magazines which proliferated in the 1920s.</i>
<u>proliferation</u>	Rapid increase in the number or amount of something. A continuing threat of nuclear proliferation .
prolix	Tediously prolonged or tending to speak or write at great length. <i>Editing a prolix manuscript.</i>
<u>propagate</u>	Cause to propagate as by grafting or layering. Sound and light propagate in this medium.
<u>scatter</u>	The act of scattering. <i>Scatter</i> cards across the table.
scattered	Occurring or found at intervals or various locations rather than all together. Changes in the angular distribution of scattered light.
<u>spray</u>	Cover by spraying with a liquid. A spray of bullets.
spread	Spread across or over. The spread of the urban population into rural areas.
<u>sprinkle</u>	The act of sprinkling or splashing water. <i>Sprinkle</i> sesame seeds over the top.
strew	Be scattered or spread untidily over (a surface or area. A small room with newspapers strew n all over the floor.
