<u>asunder</u>	Apart. <i>Torn asunder.</i>
<u>diffuse</u>	Spread or diffuse through. A diffuse historical novel.
<u>diffusion</u>	The intermingling of substances by the natural movement of their particles. The diffusion of knowledge.
<u>disappear</u>	Become less intense and fade away gradually. It is estimated that some 7000 people have been disappear ed by security forces.
<u>disappearance</u>	The event of passing out of sight. The police were investigating her disappearance .
<u>dispel</u>	Make (a doubt, feeling, or belief) disappear. The brightness of the day did nothing to dispel Elaine s dejection.
dispersal	The splitting up and selling off of a collection of artefacts or books. Dispersal of pollen by the wind.
disperse	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. The prism disperse s light.
dispersed	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. Has ties with many widely dispersed friends.
dispersion	The state of being dispersed. Some seeds rely on birds for dispersion .
<u>disseminate</u>	Spread throughout an organ or the body. There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.
dissemination	The action or fact of spreading something, especially information, widely. <i>The dissemination of public information</i> .



dissipation	The squandering of money, energy, or resources. <i>The dissipation of the mist.</i>
<u>dissolution</u>	Debauched living; dissipation. The dissolution of their marriage.
diversify	Spread into new habitats and produce variety or variegate. We re confident that the new owners will grow and diversify the company globally.
effluence	The action of flowing out.
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. His works are invariably imbue d with a sense of calm and serenity.
intersperse	Scatter among or between other things; place here and there. The debate was intersperse d with angry exchanges.
perfuse	Supply (an organ or tissue) with a fluid, typically treated blood or a blood substitute, by circulating it through blood vessels or other natural channels. <i>The isolated perfused rat liver.</i>
pervasiveness	The quality of filling or spreading throughout. The pervasiveness of the odor of cabbage in tenement hallways.
<u>proliferation</u>	Growth by the rapid multiplication of parts. A continuing threat of nuclear proliferation .
prolix	(of speech or writing) using or containing too many words; tediously lengthy. A prolix lecturer telling you more than you want to know.
<u>scatter</u>	The scattering of light other electromagnetic radiation or particles. The light is scatter ed as it strikes particles suspended in the air.
scattered	(of a person) distracted or disorganized. Changes in the angular distribution of scattered light.
<u>spray</u>	An act of spraying something. Spray water on someone.
sprayer	A device, vehicle, or aircraft used for spraying liquids. A paint sprayer .
spread	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. The very narrow spread between borrowing and deposit rates.
<u>sprinkle</u>	A light shower that falls in some locations and not others nearby. A generous sprinkle of pepper.
strew	Be scattered or spread untidily over (a surface or area. A small room with newspapers strew n all over the floor.

Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. *His whole frame* **suffuse***d* with a cold dew.
