asunder	Apart. <i>Torn asunder.</i>
diffuse	Spread or diffuse through. <i>A diffuse historical novel.</i>
diffusion	The intermingling of substances by the natural movement of their particles. <i>The diffusion of knowledge.</i>
disappear	Become less intense and fade away gradually. <i>It is estimated that some 7000 people have been disappeared by security forces.</i>
disappearance	The event of passing out of sight. <i>The police were investigating her disappearance.</i>
dispel	Make (a doubt, feeling, or belief) disappear. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to dispel Elaine's dejection.</i>
dispersal	The splitting up and selling off of a collection of artefacts or books. <i>Dispersal of pollen by the wind.</i>
disperse	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. <i>The prism dispersed light.</i>
dispersed	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely dispersed friends.</i>
dispersion	The state of being dispersed. <i>Some seeds rely on birds for dispersion.</i>
disseminate	Spread throughout an organ or the body. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.</i>
dissemination	The action or fact of spreading something, especially information, widely. <i>The dissemination of public information.</i>

dissipation	The squandering of money, energy, or resources. <i>The dissipation of the mist.</i>
dissolution	Debauched living; dissipation. <i>The dissolution of their marriage.</i>
diversify	Spread into new habitats and produce variety or variegate. <i>We re confident that the new owners will grow and diversify the company globally.</i>
effluence	The action of flowing out.
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
intersperse	Scatter among or between other things; place here and there. <i>The debate was interspersed with angry exchanges.</i>
perfuse	Supply (an organ or tissue) with a fluid, typically treated blood or a blood substitute, by circulating it through blood vessels or other natural channels. <i>The isolated perfused rat liver.</i>
pervasiveness	The quality of filling or spreading throughout. <i>The pervasiveness of the odor of cabbage in tenement hallways.</i>
proliferation	Growth by the rapid multiplication of parts. <i>A continuing threat of nuclear proliferation.</i>
prolix	(of speech or writing) using or containing too many words; tediously lengthy. <i>A prolix lecturer telling you more than you want to know.</i>
scatter	The scattering of light other electromagnetic radiation or particles. <i>The light is scattered as it strikes particles suspended in the air.</i>
scattered	(of a person) distracted or disorganized. <i>Changes in the angular distribution of scattered light.</i>
spray	An act of spraying something. <i>Spray water on someone.</i>
sprayer	A device, vehicle, or aircraft used for spraying liquids. <i>A paint sprayer.</i>
spread	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>The very narrow spread between borrowing and deposit rates.</i>
sprinkle	A light shower that falls in some locations and not others nearby. <i>A generous sprinkle of pepper.</i>
strew	Be scattered or spread untidily over (a surface or area). <i>A small room with newspapers strewn all over the floor.</i>

Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across.
