According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "distant" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Not paying attention; remote.
- Located far away spatially.
- (of a person) not closely related.
- Separate or apart in time.
- Remote in manner.
- (after a measurement) at a specified distance.
- (of a person) not intimate; cool or reserved.
- Separated in space or coming from or going to a distance.
- Remote or far apart in resemblance or relationship.
- Far away in space or time.
- Far apart in relevance or relationship or kinship.
- (of a sound) faint because far away.





## Synonyms of "Distant" as an adjective (22 Words)

absent	Not being in a specified place. An <b>absent</b> stare.
aloof	Not friendly or forthcoming; cool and distant. An <b>aloof</b> and somewhat austere figure.
<u>apart</u>	Remote and separate physically or socially. Scientists felt they were a group <b>apart</b> .
<u>away</u>	(of a baseball pitch) on the far side of home plate from the batter. <i>Tomorrow night s <b>away</b> game at Leicester.</i>
bygone	Well in the past; former. <i>Relics of a <b>bygone</b> age.</i>
detached	(of a house or other building) not joined to another on either side. On one side of the island was a hugh rock almost <b>detached</b> .
distracted	Having the attention diverted especially because of anxiety. Charlotte seemed too <b>distracted</b> to give him much attention.



distrait	Having the attention diverted especially because of anxiety. <i>He seemed oddly <b>distrait</b>.</i>
<u>far</u>	Being the animal or vehicle on the right or being on the right side of an animal or vehicle. The <b>far</b> right.
far off	Beyond a norm in opinion or actions.
faraway	Seeming remote from one's immediate surroundings. <i>The <b>faraway</b> future</i> .
<u>indirect</u>	Descended from a common ancestor but through different lines. Making <b>indirect</b> but legitimate inquiries.
long ago	Involving substantial risk.
off	Located on the side of a vehicle that is normally furthest from the kerb offside. <i>The fish was a bit off.</i>
<u>remote</u>	(of an electronic device) operating or operated at a distance by means of radio or infrared signals. <i>A golden age in the <b>remote</b> past.</i>
removed	(with reference to cousins) separated in relationship by a particular number of steps of descent. <i>A cousin once <b>removed</b>.</i>
reserved	Kept specially for a particular person. He is a <b>reserved</b> almost taciturn man.
separated	Separated at the joint. <i>His parents are <b>separated</b>.</i>
slight	Small in quantity or degree; not much or almost none or (with `a') at least some. A <b>slight</b> increase.
unapproachable	(of a place) remote and inaccessible. <i>He seems stuffy and <b>unapproachable</b></i> .
upstage	Situated or occurring at the back of a stage. This <b>upstage</b> reserve is rather ridiculous.
<u>vague</u>	Not clearly understood or expressed-Anatole Broyard- P.A.So. Their descriptions of human behavior become <b>vague</b> dull and unclear.

<u>apart</u>	Away from another or others. <i>He leapt out of the car just before it was blown <b>apart</b>.</i>
<u>away</u>	Out of the way especially away from one s thoughts. Marie felt her distress ebbing <b>away</b> .
cloistered	Of communal life sequestered from the world under religious vows. A <b>cloistered</b> upbringing.
<u>constellation</u>	A configuration of stars as seen from the earth. No two patients ever show exactly the same <b>constellation</b> of symptoms.
far	Being of a considerable distance or length. <i>He was standing in the <b>far</b> corner.</i>
faraway	Very far away in space or time. <i>The <b>faraway</b> future.</i>



farther	To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense. <i>Farther</i> from the truth.
forth	From a particular thing or place or position forth is obsolete. We rose at dawn and sallied <b>forth</b> .
<u>further</u>	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i>Before going any <b>further</b> we need to define our terms.</i>
<u>galaxy</u>	The galaxy of which the solar system is a part the Milky Way. The four musicians have played with a <b>galaxy</b> of stars.
inaccessible	Not capable of being obtained. The city centre is <b>inaccessible</b> to traffic in most places.
interstellar	Between or among stars. <i>Interstellar</i> travel.
isolated	Single; exceptional. <i>Isolated</i> patients.
<u>isolation</u>	A feeling of being disliked and alone. <b>Isolation</b> from family and friends may also contribute to anxiety.
lonely	(of a place) unfrequented and remote. A <b>lonely</b> existence.
mile	A footrace extending one mile. <i>He missed by a <b>mile</b>.</i>
nebula	(pathology) a faint cloudy spot on the cornea.
out-of-town	United States architect who was noted for his design and construction of truss bridges (1784-1844.
outback	The remote and usually uninhabited inland districts of Australia. <i>A two week tour of the <b>outback</b></i> .
outlying	Relatively far from a center or middle. <i>Outlying</i> settlements.
outpost	A station in a remote or sparsely populated location. A few scattered <b>outpost</b> s along the west coast.
<u>outside</u>	Coming from the outside. The dog was still barking <b>outside</b> .
<u>reclusive</u>	Providing privacy or seclusion. Lived an unsocial <b>reclusive</b> life.
<u>remote</u>	A remote control device. A <b>remote</b> cousin.



secluded	(of a place) not seen or visited by many people; sheltered and private. <i>The gardens are quiet and secluded</i> .
<u>solitary</u>	Single; only. <i>He was held in <b>solitary</b>.</i>
supernova	A star that explodes and becomes extremely luminous in the process.
underpopulated	Having an insufficient or very small population. The richly endowed but <b>underpopulated</b> Ivory Coast.
upstage	Move upstage forcing the other actors to turn away from the audience. <i>They were totally</i> <b>upstage</b> <i>d</i> by their co star in the film.
yon	Distant but within sight yon is dialectal. The house <b>yon</b> der.
