Definitions of "Distaste" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “distaste” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A feeling of intense dislike.*
- *Mild dislike or aversion.*



Synonyms of "Distaste" as a noun (5 Words)

- antipathy** The object of a feeling of intense aversion; something to be avoided.
*His fundamental **antipathy** to capitalism.*
- aversion** A feeling of intense dislike.
*My dog s pet **aversion** is visitors particularly males.*
- disdain** A communication that indicates lack of respect by patronizing the recipient.
*Her upper lip curled in **disdain**.*
- disfavour** Disapproval or dislike.
*The headmaster regarded her with **disfavour**.*
- dislike** An inclination to withhold approval from some person or group.
*My **dislike** of him was instinctive.*

Usage Examples of "Distaste" as a noun

- *His mouth twisted with distaste.*
- *Harry nurtured a distaste for all things athletic.*
