differentiate	Evolve so as to lead to a new species or develop in a way most suited to the environment. <i>He is unable to differentiate between fantasy and reality.</i>
differentiated	Exhibiting biological specialization; adapted during development to a specific function or environment.
discern	Distinguish (someone or something) with difficulty by sight or with the other senses. <i>She could faintly discern the shape of a skull.</i>
<u>discriminate</u>	Recognize or perceive the difference. <i>Babies can discriminate between different facial expressions.</i>
<u>distinction</u>	A grade in an examination denoting excellence. <i>She graduated with the highest distinction.</i>
