misrepresented Having an intended meaning altered or misrepresented.

misshapen So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly.

Misshapen old fingers.

out of shape Knocked unconscious by a heavy blow.



wry

(of a thing) having been corrupted or distorted from its original course,

perverted meaning, or state.

This sudden surge of **perverted** patriotism.

(of a personality or a way of thinking) unpleasantly or unhealthily

twisted abnormal; warped.

A man with a **twisted** mind.

warped Abnormal or strange; distorted.

The floors were warped and cracked.

(of a person's face or features) twisted into an expression of disgust,

disappointment, or annoyance.

With a wry Scottish wit.

morbid Caused by or altered by or manifesting disease or pathology.

His **morbid** fascination with the horrors of contemporary warfare.

A mutant form.

mutant Frequently only a small percentage of the offspring of **mutant**s resemble

their parents.

(with reference to a cell, DNA molecule, etc.) undergo or cause to undergo

mutate change in a gene or genes.

Cells mutate.

overstate To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth.

I **overstate**d my case to make my point.

A person whose behavior deviates from what is acceptable especially in

pervert sexual behavior.

Hector is a man who is simply **pervert**ed by his time.

transformed Given a completely different form or appearance.

Shocked to see the **transformed** landscape.

turn To break and turn over earth especially with a plow.

twisted (of a joint) injured by wrenching; sprained.

varied Widely different.

His work is interesting and **varied**.

warp In weaving arrange yarn so as to form the warp of a piece of cloth.
