<b><u>dominion</u></b>	A region marked off for administrative or other purposes. <i>Man s attempt to establish <b>dominion</b> over nature.</i>
<b>locale</b>	The scene of any event or action (especially the place of a meeting). <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic <b>locales</b>.</i>
<b>locality</b>	The position or site of something. <i>A working class <b>locality</b>.</i>
<b>neighbourhood</b>	A district or community within a town or city. <i>She lived in a wealthy <b>neighbourhood</b> of Boston.</i>
<b>parish</b>	A local church community. <i>A <b>parish</b> church.</i>
<b>part</b>	The appropriate or expected behaviour in a particular role or situation one s duty. <i>Body <b>parts</b>.</i>
<b><u>patch</u></b>	An adhesive piece of drug-impregnated material worn on the skin so that the drug may be absorbed gradually over a period of time. <i>The bird has a bright red <b>patch</b> under its wing.</i>
<b>place</b>	The particular portion of space occupied by something. <i>Who owns this <b>place</b>.</i>
<b><u>province</u></b>	A principal administrative division of a country or empire. <i>It was his <b>province</b> to take care of himself.</i>
<b>quarter</b>	A quarter of a hundredweight 28 pounds. <i>He fed four <b>quarters</b> into the slot machine.</i>
<b><u>region</u></b>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>In the abdominal <b>region</b>.</i>
<b><u>sector</u></b>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>Operations in the southern <b>sector</b> of the North Sea.</i>
<b>shire</b>	A county, especially in England.
<b><u>spot</u></b>	A mark on a die or on a playing card (shape depending on the suit). <i>An ideal picnic <b>spot</b>.</i>
<b>state</b>	A state of depression or agitation. <i>We re worried about her <b>state</b> of mind.</i>
<b>territorial dominion</b>	Nonprofessional soldier member of a territorial military unit.



**territory**

An area defended by a team or player in a game or sport.  
*Sorties into enemy **territory**.*

**vicinity**

The area near or surrounding a particular place.  
*The number of people living in the immediate **vicinity** was small.*

**zone**

A well-defined region extending round the earth between definite limits, especially between two parallels of latitude.

*A 40 km demilitarized **zone**.*

<b>littoral</b>	The littoral zone. <i><i>Limpets and other <b>littoral</b> molluscs.</i></i>
<u><b>local</b></u>	Of or belonging to or characteristic of a particular locality or neighborhood. <i>The street was full of <b>locals</b> and tourists.</i>
<b>locality</b>	An area or neighbourhood. <i>The rock's size and <b>locality</b>.</i>
<b>metropolitan</b>	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>The Boston <b>metropolitan</b> area.</i>
<b>municipal</b>	Relating or belonging to or characteristic of a municipality. <i><b>Municipal</b> offices.</i>

<u><b>provincial</b></u>	The head or chief of a province or of a religious order in a province. <i>The general of the Jesuits receives monthly reports from the <b>provincials</b>.</i>
<b>quarter</b>	A quarter of a hundredweight 25 pounds. <i>He fed four <b>quarters</b> into the slot machine.</i>
<u><b>realm</b></u>	A kingdom. <i>The defence of the <b>realm</b>.</i>
