locale	The scene of any event or action (especially the place of a meeting). <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic locales.</i>
locality	The position or site of something. <i>A working class locality.</i>
neighbourhood	A district or community within a town or city. <i>She lived in a wealthy neighbourhood of Boston.</i>
parish	A local church community. <i>A parish church.</i>
part	The appropriate or expected behaviour in a particular role or situation one s duty. <i>Body parts.</i>
<u>patch</u>	An adhesive piece of drug-impregnated material worn on the skin so that the drug may be absorbed gradually over a period of time. <i>The bird has a bright red patch under its wing.</i>
place	The particular portion of space occupied by something. <i>Who owns this place.</i>
<u>province</u>	A principal administrative division of a country or empire. <i>It was his province to take care of himself.</i>
quarter	A quarter of a hundredweight 28 pounds. <i>He fed four quarters into the slot machine.</i>
<u>region</u>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>In the abdominal region.</i>
<u>sector</u>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>Operations in the southern sector of the North Sea.</i>
shire	A county, especially in England.
<u>spot</u>	A mark on a die or on a playing card (shape depending on the suit). <i>An ideal picnic spot.</i>
state	A state of depression or agitation. <i>We re worried about her state of mind.</i>
territorial dominion	Nonprofessional soldier member of a territorial military unit.

territory

An area defended by a team or player in a game or sport.
*Sorties into enemy **territory**.*

vicinity

The area near or surrounding a particular place.
*The number of people living in the immediate **vicinity** was small.*

zone

A well-defined region extending round the earth between definite limits, especially between two parallels of latitude.
*A 40 km demilitarized **zone**.*

zone Designate a specific area for use or development as a particular zone in planning.
*Houston he told us was the only town in the country that was **zoned** properly.*
