<b>change</b>	Exchange something with someone else giving one thing and receiving something of the same kind in return. <i>Fame hasn't <b>changed</b> her one bit.</i>
<b>changed</b>	Changed in constitution or structure or composition by metamorphism. <i><b>Changed</b> styles of dress.</i>
<u><b>conversion</b></u>	(in the context of online marketing) the proportion of people viewing an advertisement and going on to buy the product, click on a link, etc. <i>He insists that real <b>conversion</b> is a matter of the heart.</i>
<b>convert</b>	A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief. <i><b>Convert</b> slaves to laborers.</i>
<b>difference</b>	The number that remains after subtraction; the number that when added to the subtrahend gives the minuend. <i>There are many <b>differences</b> between jazz and rock.</i>
<b>different</b>	Distinctly separate from the first. <i>Came to a <b>different</b> conclusion.</i>
<u><b>dissimilar</b></u>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>A group of very <b>dissimilar</b> people.</i>
<b>diversity</b>	The condition or result of being changeable. <i>Equality and <b>diversity</b> should be supported for their own sake.</i>
<b>each</b>	(used of count nouns) every one considered individually. <i>The tickets cost 11 <b>each</b>.</i>
<b>economic</b>	Relating to economics or the economy. <i>An <b>economical</b> use of her time.</i>
<b>feint</b>	Any distracting or deceptive maneuver (as a mock attack). <i>The midfielder <b>feinted</b> to shoot.</i>
<b>machiavellian</b>	Of or relating to Machiavelli or the principles of conduct he recommended.
<u><b>maneuver</b></u>	A plan for attaining a particular goal. <i>He <b>maneuvered</b> to get the chairmanship.</i>
<b>obstructionist</b>	Someone who systematically obstructs some action that others want to take.
<u><b>ploy</b></u>	An activity done for amusement. <i>The eternal cross stitch I was set to do before I could indulge my own <b>loys</b>.</i>
<b>stratagem</b>	A plan or scheme, especially one used to outwit an opponent or achieve an end. <i>A series of devious <b>stratagems</b>.</i>

<b>strategically</b>	With regard to strategy. <i>Violence was deployed <b>strategically</b>.</i>
<b>strategy</b>	An elaborate and systematic plan of action. <i>Shifts in marketing <b>strategy</b>.</i>
<b>tactics</b>	The branch of military science dealing with detailed maneuvers to achieve objectives set by strategy.
<u><b>transform</b></u>	The product of a transformation. <i>Lasers have <b>transformed</b> cardiac surgery.</i>
<b>transformation</b>	A process by which one figure, expression, or function is converted into another one of similar value. <i>British society underwent a radical <b>transformation</b>.</i>
<b>transformed</b>	Given a completely different form or appearance. <i>Shocked to see the <b>transformed</b> landscape.</i>
<b>transition</b>	Undergo or cause to undergo a process or period of transition. <i>Students in <b>transition</b> from one programme to another.</i>
<u><b>variance</b></u>	Discord that splits a group. <i>Her light tone was at <b>variance</b> with her sudden trembling.</i>
<b>variation</b>	A deviation of a celestial body from its mean orbit or motion. <i>Who is responsible for these <b>variations</b> in taxation.</i>
<u><b>varied</b></u>	Incorporating a number of different types or elements; showing variation or variety. <i>The phenomena were very <b>varied</b>.</i>
<b>variegation</b>	The act of introducing variety (especially in investments or in the variety of goods and services offered).
<u><b>vary</b></u>	Change from one condition, form, or state to another. <i>His moods <b>vary</b> depending on the weather.</i>
