amplify	Increase the volume of. <i>The manufacturers have developed a system of amplifying the radio signal.</i>
bloat	Make bloated or swollen. <i>The dead man s stomach was bloated.</i>
broad	Broad in scope or content T G Winner. <i>A broad river.</i>
broaden	Make broader. <i>The road broadened.</i>
circulate	Cause to move in a circuit or system. <i>Antibodies circulate in the bloodstream.</i>
diffuse	Spread or diffuse through. <i>Diffuse hyperplasia.</i>
diffusion	The spreading of something more widely. <i>The rapid diffusion of ideas and technology.</i>
dispel	To cause to separate and go in different directions. <i>Dispel doubts.</i>
disperse	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. <i>Emulsions should be examined after storage for droplet size of the disperse phase.</i>
disseminate	Cause to become widely known. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.</i>
dissemination	The property of being diffused or dispersed. <i>The dissemination of public information.</i>
dissipate	Cause (energy) to be lost through its conversion to heat. <i>No power is dissipated in this sort of control element.</i>

expand	Expand the influence of. <i>The work began as a short story and was later expanded into a novel.</i>
expansion	The increase in the volume of fuel on combustion in the cylinder of an engine, or the piston stroke in which this occurs. <i>A small expansion of industry.</i>
exponentially	By means of or as expressed by a mathematical exponent. <i>Values distributed exponentially according to a given time constant.</i>
extend	Extend one's limbs or muscles or the entire body. <i>Can we extend the legs of this dining table.</i>
holding	Something owned; any tangible or intangible possession that is owned by someone. <i>Commercial property holdings.</i>
pervasiveness	The quality of spreading widely or being present throughout an area or a group of people. <i>The pervasiveness of violence on television.</i>
proliferate	Grow rapidly. <i>The science fiction magazines which proliferated in the 1920s.</i>
proliferation	A large number of something. <i>A continuing threat of nuclear proliferation.</i>
propagate	Cause to propagate as by grafting or layering. <i>Propagate sound or light through air.</i>
scatter	Sow by scattering. <i>There are many watermills scattered throughout the marshlands.</i>
scattered	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>Scattered villages.</i>
spray	Cover by spraying with a liquid. <i>Water sprayed into the air.</i>
spread	Spread across or over. <i>Bobby spread his arms wide.</i>
spreading	Process or result of distributing or extending over a wide expanse of space.
stretching	Act of expanding by lengthening or widening.
strew	Spread by scattering. <i>Leaves strewed the path.</i>
unfold	Open to the view. <i>Eva unfolded her secret exploits to Mattie.</i>
widen	Become broader or wider or more extensive. <i>The lane widened out into a small clearing.</i>
