## Associations of "Dividends" (30 Words)

<b>bonus</b>	An extra dividend or issue paid to the shareholders of a company. <i>Big Christmas <b>bonuses</b>.</i>
<b>cash</b>	Exchange for cash. <i>The bank <b>cash</b>ed her cheque.</i>
<b>deposit</b>	The natural process of laying down a deposit of something. <i>The <b>deposits</b> of salt on the paintwork.</i>
<b>earnings</b>	The excess of revenues over outlays in a given period of time (including depreciation and other non-cash expenses). <i>They saved a quarter of all their <b>earnings</b>.</i>
<b>emolument</b>	Compensation received by virtue of holding an office or having employment (usually in the form of wages or fees). <i>The directors <b>emoluments</b>.</i>
<b>finance</b>	Monetary support for an enterprise. <i>The clearing banks are important sources of <b>finance</b>.</i>
<b>impale</b>	(of a coat of arms) adjoin (another coat of arms) on the same shield. <i>The <b>impaled</b> arms of her husband and her father.</i>
<b>incentive</b>	A thing that motivates or encourages someone to do something. <i>Give farmers an <b>incentive</b> to improve their land.</i>
<b>income</b>	Money received, especially on a regular basis, for work or through investments. <i>Figures showed an overall increase in <b>income</b> this year.</i>
<b>invest</b>	Make an investment. <i>He stands before you <b>invested</b> in the full canonicals of his calling.</i>
<b>meed</b>	A person’s deserved share of praise, honour, etc. <i>He must extract from her some <b>meed</b> of approbation.</i>
<b>overpayment</b>	Payment in excess of what is due. <i>A refund for <b>overpayment</b> of tax.</i>

<b>payment</b>	Something given as a reward or in recompense for something done. <i>Three interest free monthly <b>payments</b>.</i>
<b>redistribute</b>	Distribute anew. <i>Their primary concern was to <b>redistribute</b> income from rich to poor.</i>
<b>redistribution</b>	Distributing again. <i>Social justice required <b>redistribution</b> of wealth.</i>
<b>refund</b>	Money returned to a payer. <i>You may be allowed to claim a <b>refund</b> of the tax.</i>
<b>remunerate</b>	Pay (someone) for services rendered or work done. <i>They should be <b>remunerated</b> fairly for their work.</i>
<b>remuneration</b>	Money paid for work or a service. <i>They work in excess of their contracted hours for no additional <b>remuneration</b>.</i>
<b>revenue</b>	The department of the civil service collecting state revenue. <i>His priority was to raise government <b>revenue</b> and to lower expenditure.</i>
<b>reward</b>	Strengthen and support with rewards. <i>A slap on the face was his <b>reward</b> for his cheek.</i>
<b>salary</b>	Pay a salary to. <i>The Chinese system <b>salary</b> the doctor and stop his pay when you get ill.</i>
<b>shareholder</b>	An owner of shares in a company.
<b>spike</b>	Of a newspaper editor reject a story by or as if by filing it on a spike. <i>She <b>spiked</b> another oyster.</i>
<b>stake</b>	Mark with a stake. <i>Bishop Ridley was burned at the <b>stake</b>.</i>
<b>stick</b>	In field hockey the foul play of raising the stick above the shoulder. <i>The girl was a <b>stick</b>.</i>
<b>thorn</b>	A thorny bush shrub or tree especially a hawthorn. <i>He s a <b>thorn</b> in my flesh.</i>
<b>turnover</b>	The rate at which employees leave a workforce and are replaced. <i>An annual <b>turnover</b> of staff as high as 100.</i>
<b>unremunerative</b>	Bringing little or no profit or income. <i><b>Unremunerative</b> research work.</i>
<b>vat</b>	Place or treat in a vat. <i>The grapes are <b>vatted</b> for between 15 and 21 days and then aged in small barrels.</i>
<b>wage</b>	The result or effect of doing something considered wrong or unwise. <i>It is necessary to destroy their capacity to <b>wage</b> war.</i>
