<b>jehovah</b>	A name for the God of the Old Testament as transliterated from the Hebrew consonants YHVH.
<b>lord</b>	(in the UK) the House of Lords, or its members collectively. <i>Our <b>lord</b> the king.</i>
<b>maker</b>	God. <i>Film <b>makers</b>.</i>
<b>man of god</b>	A manservant who acts as a personal attendant to his employer.
<b>man of the cloth</b>	Someone who serves in the armed forces; a member of a military force.
<b>member of the clergy</b>	Anything that belongs to a set or class.
<b>preacher</b>	A person who preaches, especially a minister of religion.
<b>priest</b>	A person who performs religious duties and ceremonies in a non-Christian religion. <i>The <b>priest</b> celebrated mass at a small altar off the north transept.</i>
<b>theologian</b>	Someone who is learned in theology or who speculates about theology.



<b>delightful</b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A <b>delightful</b> surprise.</i>
<b>devoted to god</b>	Dedicated exclusively to a purpose or use.
<b>devotional</b>	Of or used in religious worship. <i>A <b>devotional</b> exercise.</i>
<b>elysian</b>	Being of such surpassing excellence as to suggest inspiration by the gods. <i>An <b>elysian</b> meal.</i>
<b>engaging</b>	Charming and attractive. <i>An <b>engaging</b> smile.</i>

<b>godly</b>	Devoutly religious; pious. <i>Everything is black or white satanic or <b>godly</b>.</i>
<b>good-looking</b>	Pleasing in appearance especially by reason of conformity to ideals of form and proportion- Thackeray.
<b>gorgeous</b>	Very pleasant or enjoyable. <i>The weather was <b>gorgeous</b>.</i>
<b>handsome</b>	(of a number, sum of money, or margin) substantial. <i>Very pretty but not so extraordinarily <b>handsome</b>.</i>
<b>holy</b>	(of a person) devoted to the service of God. <i>Saints and <b>holy</b> men.</i>
<b>inspired</b>	Of extraordinary quality, as if arising from some external creative impulse. <i>They had to thank the goalkeeper for some <b>inspired</b> saves.</i>
<b>lovely</b>	Appealing to the emotions as well as the eye. <i>She looked <b>lovely</b>.</i>
<b>prepossessing</b>	Creating a favorable impression. <i>He was not a <b>prepossessing</b> sight.</i>
<b>providential</b>	Relating to or characteristic of providence- M.R.Cohen. <i><b>Providential</b> care.</i>
<b>ravishing</b>	Stunningly beautiful. <i>She looked <b>ravishing</b>.</i>
<b>religious</b>	(of a belief or practice) forming part of someone's faith in a divine being. <i>She has strong <b>religious</b> convictions.</i>
<b>sacred</b>	Regarded with great respect and reverence by a particular religion, group, or individual. <i>A morning hour <b>sacred</b> to study.</i>
<b>saintly</b>	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>A <b>saintly</b> concern for his fellow men.</i>
<b>sanctified</b>	Made or declared or believed to be holy; devoted to a deity or some religious ceremony or use. <i><b>Sanctified</b> wine.</i>

<b>hallowed</b>	Worthy of religious veneration. <i>Jerusalem s <b>hallowed</b> soil.</i>
<b>heaven</b>	A place regarded in various religions as the abode of God (or the gods) and the angels, and of the good after death, often traditionally depicted as being above the sky. <i>The everlasting happiness with God that we call <b>heaven</b>.</i>
<b>heavenly</b>	Of heaven; divine. <i><b>Heavenly</b> constellations.</i>
<b>heresy</b>	Opinion profoundly at odds with what is generally accepted. <i>The <b>heresy</b> of being uncommitted to the right political dogma.</i>
<b>liturgy</b>	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>A tradition which found its expression in ritual and <b>liturgy</b>.</i>
<b>omnipotence</b>	The quality of having unlimited or very great power. <i>God s <b>omnipotence</b>.</i>
<b>omnipotent</b>	Having unlimited power. <i>God is described as <b>omnipotent</b> and benevolent.</i>

<b>omniscience</b>	The state of being omniscient; having infinite knowledge. <i>His reputation for near <b>omniscience</b> and infallibility.</i>
<b><u>paradise</u></b>	The abode of Adam and Eve before the Fall in the biblical account of the Creation; the Garden of Eden. <i>My idea of <b>paradise</b> is to relax on the seafront.</i>
<b><u>pilgrimage</u></b>	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>He wanted to go on a <b>pilgrimage</b> to Santiago de Compostela.</i>
<b><u>pious</u></b>	(of a hope) sincere but unlikely to be fulfilled. <i>A deeply <b>pious</b> woman.</i>
<b>sacred</b>	Connected with God or a god or dedicated to a religious purpose and so deserving veneration. <i>The <b>sacred</b> mosque.</i>
<b>sacrilege</b>	Violation or misuse of what is regarded as sacred. <i>Putting ecclesiastical vestments to secular use was considered <b>sacrilege</b>.</i>
<b>saintly</b>	Relating to a saint. <i>A truly <b>saintly</b> woman.</i>
<b><u>sanctity</u></b>	Ultimate importance and inviolability. <i>The site of the tomb was a place of <b>sanctity</b> for the ancient Egyptians.</i>
<b>scripture</b>	The sacred writings of Christianity contained in the Bible. <i>The fundamental teachings of the <b>scriptures</b>.</i>
<b>seraphic</b>	Of or relating to an angel of the first order. <i>He imagined a <b>seraphic</b> presence in the room.</i>
<b><u>shrine</u></b>	Enshrine. <i>The saint's bones were <b>enshrined</b> in the cathedral.</i>
<b>supernal</b>	Being or coming from on high. <i>He is the <b>supernal</b> poet of our age.</i>
