



religious	(of a belief or practice) forming part of someone's faith in a divine being. <i>She has strong religious convictions.</i>
sacred	Regarded with great respect and reverence by a particular religion, group, or individual. A morning hour sacred to study.
saintly	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. A <i>saintly</i> concern for his fellow men.
sanctified	Made or declared or believed to be holy; devoted to a deity or some religious ceremony or use. <i>Sanctified</i> wine.
seraphic	Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub. <i>He imagined a seraphic presence in the room.</i>
winsome	Charming in a childlike or naive way. A winsome smile.

saintly	Relating to a saint. A truly saintly woman.

scripture	The sacred writings of Christianity contained in the Bible. The fundamental teachings of the scripture s.
seraphic	Of or relating to an angel of the first order. <i>He imagined a seraphic presence in the room.</i>
