man of god	A manservant who acts as a personal attendant to his employer.
man of the cloth	Someone who serves in the armed forces; a member of a military force.
member of the clergy	Anything that belongs to a set or class.
preacher	A person who preaches, especially a minister of religion.
priest	A person who performs religious duties and ceremonies in a non-Christian religion. <i>The priest celebrated mass at a small altar off the north transept.</i>
theologian	Someone who is learned in theology or who speculates about theology.

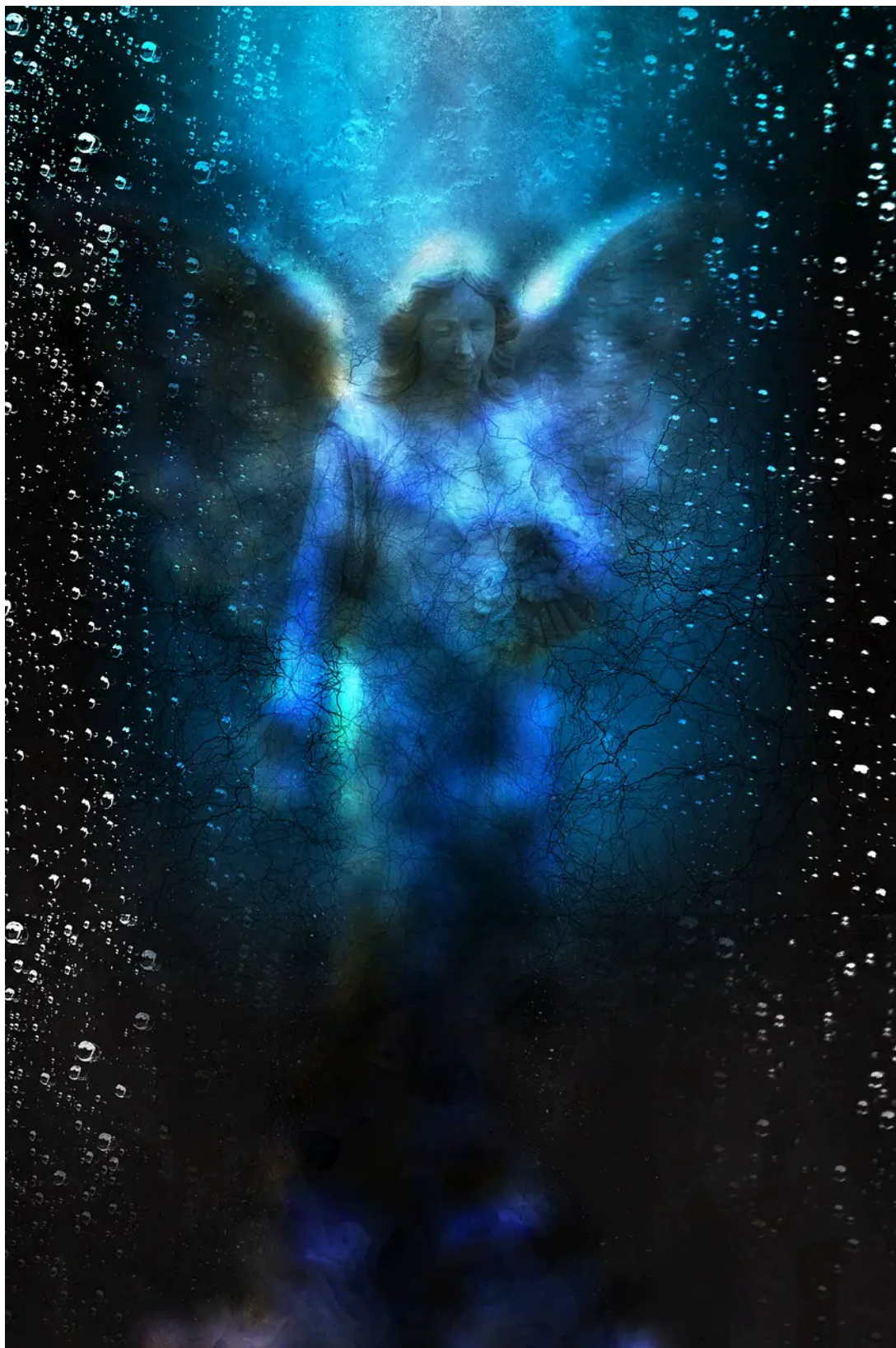

delightful	Causing delight; charming. <i>A delightful surprise.</i>
devoted to god	Dedicated exclusively to a purpose or use.
devotional	Of or used in religious worship. <i>A devotional exercise.</i>
elysian	Being of such surpassing excellence as to suggest inspiration by the gods. <i>An elysian meal.</i>
engaging	Charming and attractive. <i>An engaging smile.</i>
godlike	Befitting a god. <i>Man must play God for he has acquired certain godlike powers.</i>

godly	Devoutly religious; pious. <i>Everything is black or white satanic or godly.</i>
good-looking	Pleasing in appearance especially by reason of conformity to ideals of form and proportion- Thackeray.
gorgeous	Very pleasant or enjoyable. <i>The weather was gorgeous.</i>
handsome	(of a number, sum of money, or margin) substantial. <i>Very pretty but not so extraordinarily handsome.</i>
holy	(of a person) devoted to the service of God. <i>Saints and holy men.</i>
inspired	Of extraordinary quality, as if arising from some external creative impulse. <i>They had to thank the goalkeeper for some inspired saves.</i>
lovely	Appealing to the emotions as well as the eye. <i>She looked lovely.</i>
prepossessing	Creating a favorable impression. <i>He was not a prepossessing sight.</i>
providential	Relating to or characteristic of providence- M.R.Cohen. <i>Providential care.</i>
ravishing	Stunningly beautiful. <i>She looked ravishing.</i>
religious	(of a belief or practice) forming part of someone's faith in a divine being. <i>She has strong religious convictions.</i>
sacred	Regarded with great respect and reverence by a particular religion, group, or individual. <i>A morning hour sacred to study.</i>
saintly	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>A saintly concern for his fellow men.</i>
sanctified	Made or declared or believed to be holy; devoted to a deity or some religious ceremony or use. <i>Sanctified wine.</i>
seraphic	Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub. <i>He imagined a seraphic presence in the room.</i>
winsome	Charming in a childlike or naive way. <i>A winsome smile.</i>

heavenly	Of heaven; divine. <i>Heavenly constellations.</i>
heresy	Opinion profoundly at odds with what is generally accepted. <i>The heresy of being uncommitted to the right political dogma.</i>
liturgy	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>A tradition which found its expression in ritual and liturgy.</i>
omnipotence	The quality of having unlimited or very great power. <i>God s omnipotence.</i>
omnipotent	Having unlimited power. <i>God is described as omnipotent and benevolent.</i>

omniscience	The state of being omniscient; having infinite knowledge. <i>His reputation for near omniscience and infallibility.</i>
paradise	The abode of Adam and Eve before the Fall in the biblical account of the Creation; the Garden of Eden. <i>My idea of paradise is to relax on the seafront.</i>
pilgrimage	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>He wanted to go on a pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela.</i>
pious	(of a hope) sincere but unlikely to be fulfilled. <i>A deeply pious woman.</i>
sacred	Connected with God or a god or dedicated to a religious purpose and so deserving veneration. <i>The sacred mosque.</i>
sacrilege	Violation or misuse of what is regarded as sacred. <i>Putting ecclesiastical vestments to secular use was considered sacrilege.</i>
saintly	Relating to a saint. <i>A truly saintly woman.</i>
sanctity	Ultimate importance and inviolability. <i>The site of the tomb was a place of sanctity for the ancient Egyptians.</i>
scripture	The sacred writings of Christianity contained in the Bible. <i>The fundamental teachings of the scriptures.</i>
seraphic	Of or relating to an angel of the first order. <i>He imagined a seraphic presence in the room.</i>
shrine	Enshrine. <i>The saint's bones were enshrined in the cathedral.</i>
supernal	Being or coming from on high. <i>He is the supernal poet of our age.</i>
