godliness	Piety by virtue of being a godly person. <i>A man of great godliness.</i>
holiness	Denoting a Christian renewal movement originating in the mid 19th century among Methodists in the US, emphasizing the Wesleyan doctrine of the sanctification of believers. <i>A life of holiness and total devotion to God.</i>
<u>immortal</u>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>Shakespeare is one of the immortals.</i>
mother goddess	A stringy slimy substance consisting of yeast cells and bacteria; forms during fermentation and is added to cider or wine to produce vinegar.
religion	A particular system of faith and worship. <i>The world s great religions.</i>
religious studies	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience.
sacredness	The quality of being sacred.
sanctitude	The state or quality of being holy, sacred, or saintly.
<u>sanctity</u>	Ultimate importance and inviolability. <i>The sanctity of human life.</i>
scripture	Any writing that is regarded as sacred by a religious group. <i>Passages of scripture.</i>
theology	The rational and systematic study of religion and its influences and of the nature of religious truth. <i>In Christian theology God comes to be conceived as Father and Son.</i>

believing	The cognitive process that leads to convictions. <i>Seeing is believing.</i>
bible	The sacred writings of the Christian religions.
blaspheme	Speak of in an irreverent or impious manner. <i>Blaspheme God.</i>
bless	Make the sign of the cross. <i>She silently blessed the premonition which had made her pack her best dress.</i>
canon	A Church decree or law. <i>The biblical canon.</i>
consecrate	Make or declare (something, typically a church) sacred; dedicate formally to a religious purpose. <i>The consecrated chapel.</i>
deify	Consider as a god or godlike. <i>These young men deify financial success.</i>

deist	Of or relating to deism.
deity	Divine status, quality, or nature. <i>Also on show is a bronze falcon deity.</i>
enshrine	Place (a revered or precious object) in an appropriate receptacle. <i>Relics are enshrined under altars.</i>
goddess	A woman who is greatly admired, especially for her beauty. <i>Athena Nike goddess of victory.</i>
heavenly	Very pleasing; wonderful. <i>A heavenly body.</i>
idolatrous	Blindly or excessively devoted or adoring. <i>Idolatrous religions.</i>
liturgy	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>At the conclusion of the liturgy the Bishop presented the certificates.</i>
missal	A book containing all the prayers and responses needed to celebrate Mass throughout the year. <i>Christian influence on Viking art is demonstrated by the illuminated missals and gold reliquaries.</i>
mystical	Of hidden or esoteric meaning. <i>The mystical theology of Richard Rolle.</i>
omniscience	The state of being omniscient; having infinite knowledge. <i>The notion of divine omniscience.</i>
orison	A prayer.
pantheistic	Of or relating to pantheism.
pantheon	A monument commemorating a nation's dead heroes. <i>The deities of the Hindu pantheon.</i>
pray	Address a deity a prophet a saint or an object of worship say a prayer. <i>I prayed that James wouldn't notice.</i>
priestess	A female priest of a non-Christian religion.
sacrosanct	Must be kept sacred. <i>The individual's right to work has been upheld as sacrosanct.</i>
temple	A thing regarded as holy or likened to a temple especially a person's body. <i>June treats her body like a temple she takes yoga classes every day.</i>
theism	The doctrine or belief in the existence of a God or gods. <i>There are many different forms of theism.</i>
theologian	Someone who is learned in theology or who speculates about theology.
theological	Relating to the study of the nature of God and religious belief. <i>A reworking of the past that was partly theological.</i>
