<b>godliness</b>	Piety by virtue of being a godly person. <i>A man of great <b>godliness</b>.</i>
<b>holiness</b>	Denoting a Christian renewal movement originating in the mid 19th century among Methodists in the US, emphasizing the Wesleyan doctrine of the sanctification of believers. <i>A life of <b>holiness</b> and total devotion to God.</i>
<b><u>immortal</u></b>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>Shakespeare is one of the <b>immortals</b>.</i>
<b>mother goddess</b>	A stringy slimy substance consisting of yeast cells and bacteria; forms during fermentation and is added to cider or wine to produce vinegar.
<b>religion</b>	A particular system of faith and worship. <i>The world s great <b>religions</b>.</i>
<b>religious studies</b>	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience.
<b>sacredness</b>	The quality of being sacred.
<b>sanctitude</b>	The state or quality of being holy, sacred, or saintly.
<b><u>sanctity</u></b>	Ultimate importance and inviolability. <i>The <b>sanctity</b> of human life.</i>
<b>scripture</b>	Any writing that is regarded as sacred by a religious group. <i>Passages of <b>scripture</b>.</i>
<b>theology</b>	The rational and systematic study of religion and its influences and of the nature of religious truth. <i>In Christian <b>theology</b> God comes to be conceived as Father and Son.</i>

<b>believing</b>	The cognitive process that leads to convictions. <i>Seeing is <b>believing</b>.</i>
<b>bible</b>	The sacred writings of the Christian religions.
<b>blaspheme</b>	Speak of in an irreverent or impious manner. <i><b>Blaspheme</b> God.</i>
<b>bless</b>	Make the sign of the cross. <i>She silently <b>blessed</b> the premonition which had made her pack her best dress.</i>
<b>canon</b>	A Church decree or law. <i>The biblical <b>canon</b>.</i>
<b>consecrate</b>	Make or declare (something, typically a church) sacred; dedicate formally to a religious purpose. <i>The <b>consecrated</b> chapel.</i>
<b>deify</b>	Consider as a god or godlike. <i>These young men <b>deify</b> financial success.</i>

<b>deist</b>	Of or relating to deism.
<b>deity</b>	Divine status, quality, or nature. <i>Also on show is a bronze falcon <b>deity</b>.</i>
<b>enshrine</b>	Place (a revered or precious object) in an appropriate receptacle. <i>Relics are <b>enshrined</b> under altars.</i>
<b>goddess</b>	A woman who is greatly admired, especially for her beauty. <i>Athena Nike <b>goddess</b> of victory.</i>
<b>heavenly</b>	Very pleasing; wonderful. <i>A <b>heavenly</b> body.</i>
<b>idolatrous</b>	Blindly or excessively devoted or adoring. <i><b>Idolatrous</b> religions.</i>
<b>liturgy</b>	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>At the conclusion of the <b>liturgy</b> the Bishop presented the certificates.</i>
<b>missal</b>	A book containing all the prayers and responses needed to celebrate Mass throughout the year. <i>Christian influence on Viking art is demonstrated by the illuminated <b>missals</b> and gold reliquaries.</i>
<b>mystical</b>	Of hidden or esoteric meaning. <i>The <b>mystical</b> theology of Richard Rolle.</i>
<b>omniscience</b>	The state of being omniscient; having infinite knowledge. <i>The notion of divine <b>omniscience</b>.</i>
<b>orison</b>	A prayer.
<b>pantheistic</b>	Of or relating to pantheism.
<b>pantheon</b>	A monument commemorating a nation's dead heroes. <i>The deities of the Hindu <b>pantheon</b>.</i>
<b>pray</b>	Address a deity a prophet a saint or an object of worship say a prayer. <i>I <b>prayed</b> that James wouldn't notice.</i>
<b>priestess</b>	A female priest of a non-Christian religion.
<b>sacrosanct</b>	Must be kept sacred. <i>The individual's right to work has been upheld as <b>sacrosanct</b>.</i>
<b>temple</b>	A thing regarded as holy or likened to a temple especially a person's body. <i>June treats her body like a <b>temple</b> she takes yoga classes every day.</i>
<b>theism</b>	The doctrine or belief in the existence of a God or gods. <i>There are many different forms of <b>theism</b>.</i>
<b>theologian</b>	Someone who is learned in theology or who speculates about theology.
<b>theological</b>	Relating to the study of the nature of God and religious belief. <i>A reworking of the past that was partly <b>theological</b>.</i>
