## Associations of "Documented" (30 Words)

- accuracy** The quality or state of being correct or precise.  
*We have confidence in the **accuracy** of the statistics.*
- airmail** Send or transport by airmail.  
*I have a sheaf of letters to **airmail**.*
- authentic** (in existentialist philosophy) relating to or denoting an emotionally appropriate, significant, purposive, and responsible mode of human life.  
*The letter is now accepted as an **authentic** document.*
- authenticated** Established as genuine.
- authorized** Endowed with authority.  
*The **authorized** biography.*
- certified** Fit to be certified as insane and treated accordingly.  
*A **certified** accountant.*

<b>chartered</b>	Hired for the exclusive temporary use of a group of travelers. <i>A <b>chartered</b> plane.</i>
<b>clinically</b>	In a bare, functional, and clean way. <i>They used murder as a cold blooded and <b>clinically</b> calculated means to a political end.</i>
<u><b>credible</b></u>	Appearing to merit belief or acceptance. <i><b>Credible</b> information.</i>
<b>dependable</b>	Financially sound. <i>A <b>dependable</b> worker.</i>
<b>duly</b>	In accordance with what is appropriate or suitable for the circumstances. <i>The ceremony <b>duly</b> began at midnight.</i>
<b>eligible</b>	Having the right to do or obtain something; satisfying the appropriate conditions. <i><b>Eligible</b> to run for office.</i>
<u><b>empirical</b></u>	Derived from experiment and observation rather than theory. <i>They provided considerable <b>empirical</b> evidence to support their argument.</i>
<b>encyclopedia</b>	A book or set of books giving information on many subjects or on many aspects of one subject and typically arranged alphabetically.
<b>entry</b>	A written record of a commercial transaction. <i>A fluffed <b>entry</b>.</i>
<b>examiner</b>	An investigator who observes carefully. <i>A police vehicle <b>examiner</b>.</i>
<b>indefeasible</b>	Not liable to being annulled or voided or undone. <i>An <b>indefeasible</b> right to freedom.</i>
<b>medically</b>	In a way that relates to the science or practice of medicine. <i><b>Medically</b> trained staff.</i>
<b>objectively</b>	In a way that is not influenced by personal feelings or opinions. <i>The physical world we think of as <b>objectively</b> true.</i>
<b>observable</b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>An <b>observable</b> change in behavior.</i>
<u><b>proven</b></u>	(of a new method, system, or treatment) tried and tested. <i>A system based on <b>proven</b> technologies.</i>
<u><b>qualified</b></u>	Holding appropriate documentation and officially on record as qualified to perform a specified function or practice a specified skill. <i>Newly <b>qualified</b> nurses.</i>
<b>reasonable</b>	As much as is appropriate or fair; moderate. <i>The carpet is in <b>reasonable</b> condition.</i>

- registered** Of a letter or parcel sent by registered post.  
*Record is made of **registered** mail at each point on its route to assure safe delivery.*
- reliable** A reliable person or thing.  
*The supporting cast includes old **reliables** like Mitchell.*
- scientifically** In a way that relates to or is used in science.  
***Scientifically** minded people.*
- subscribe** Mark with one's signature; write one's name (on).  
*Some 40 000 users have **subscribed** to the service.*
- tested** Tested and proved useful or correct.  
*A **tested** method.*
- trained** Having been taught a particular skill or type of behaviour through practice and instruction over a period of time.  
*Well **trained** servants.*
- verifiable** Capable of being verified.  
*A **verifiable** account of the incident.*
