## Associations of "Doe eyed" (30 Words)

<a href="#">askance</a>	With an attitude or look of suspicion or disapproval. <i>A waiter looked <b>askance</b> at his jeans.</i>
<a href="#">behold</a>	See or observe (someone or something, especially of remarkable or impressive nature). <i><b>Behold</b> Christ.</i>
<b>blink</b>	Try to control or prevent tears by blinking. <i>The government <b>blinked</b> only after losing 46 of the first 48 hearings.</i>
<a href="#">browse</a>	Reading superficially or at random. <i>This book is a useful <b>browse</b> for a new worker in the field.</i>
<b>deer</b>	A hooved grazing or browsing animal, with branched bony antlers that are shed annually and typically borne only by the male.
<b>eyelid</b>	Each of the upper and lower folds of skin which cover the eye when closed.
<a href="#">gaze</a>	Look steadily and intently, especially in admiration, surprise, or thought. <i>He turned following her <b>gaze</b>.</i>
<b>leer</b>	A suggestive or sneering look or grin. <i>He gave me a sly <b>leer</b>.</i>
<b>look</b>	An expression of a feeling or thought by looking. <i>She <b>looked</b> her devotion to me.</i>
<b>macroscopic</b>	Relating to large-scale or general analysis.
<b>observing</b>	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
<b>ocular</b>	Of or relating to or resembling the eye. <i><b>Ocular</b> muscles.</i>
<b>optic</b>	A lens or other optical component in an optical instrument. <i>The <b>optic</b> or <b>optical</b> axis of the eye.</i>
<b>optical</b>	(of a device) requiring electromagnetic radiation for its operation. <i>An <b>optical</b> illusion.</i>

<b>perceptual</b>	Relating to the ability to interpret or become aware of something through the senses. <i>A patient with <b>perceptual</b> problems who cannot judge distances.</i>
<b>searching</b>	Thoroughly scrutinizing, especially in a disconcerting way. <i><b>Searching</b> insights.</i>
<b>see</b>	See and understand have a good eye. <i>I ll probably <b>see</b> you at the meeting.</i>
<b>sensory</b>	Of a nerve fiber or impulse originating outside and passing toward the central nervous system. <i>The <b>sensory</b> cortex.</i>
<b>sidelong</b>	With the side toward someone or something- Nathaniel Hawthorne. <i>Shot out <b>sidelong</b> boughs.</i>
<b>sight</b>	Take a detailed visual measurement of something with or as with a sight. <i>Tell me when you <b>sight</b> London Bridge.</i>
<b>sneer</b>	A facial expression of contempt or scorn; the upper lip curls. <i>She <b>sneered</b> her contempt.</i>
<b>spectacle</b>	A blunder that makes you look ridiculous used in the phrase make a spectacle of yourself. <i>The tragic <b>spectacle</b> of cripples trying to escape.</i>
<b>squint</b>	Be cross eyed have a squint or strabismus. <i>The <b>squint</b> bottom edge of the puzzle.</i>
<b>stare</b>	Fixate one's eyes. <i>She tried hard not to <b>stare</b>.</i>
<b>telescopic</b>	Relating to or made with a telescope. <i>There are interesting <b>telescopic</b> objects in Bo tes.</i>
<b>visible</b>	Visible imports or exports. <i><b>Visible</b> files.</i>
<b>vision</b>	The images seen on a television screen. <i>A utopian <b>vision</b> of society.</i>
<b>visual</b>	Visible- Shakespeare. <i>A <b>visual</b> presentation.</i>
<b>watch</b>	A person employed to keep watch for some anticipated event. <i>The woman with a piercing shriek called the <b>watch</b>.</i>
<b>wink</b>	An act of winking. <i>Barney gave him a knowing <b>wink</b>.</i>
